This bill modifies the Acupuncture Licensing Act by amending definitions and the
membership of the Acupuncture Licensing Board.
Highlighted Provisions:
This bill:
amends the definition of acupuncture-related adjunctive therapies to include:
 modern research and other therapies designated by division rule; and
 the administration or provision of dietary guidelines, herbs, supplements, and
homeopathics;
 states that the division shall make rules in accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3,
Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act;
 amends the Acupuncture Licensing Board membership to include four licensed
acupuncturists instead of two and removes one physician and one other licensed
health care practitioner from the board membership; and
makes technical changes.

on t	traditional oriental medical diagnosis and [concepts] modern research;
	(ii) the recommendation, administration, or provision of dietary guidelines, herbs,
sup	plements, homeopathics, and therapeutic exercise based on traditional oriental medical
diag	gnosis and [concepts] modern research according to practitioner training; and
	(iii) the practice described in Subsections (4)(a) and (b) on an animal to the extent
per	mitted by:
	(A) Subsection 58-28-307(12);
	(B) the provisions of this chapter; and

	(c) "Practice of acupuncture" does not include:
	(i) the manual manipulation or adjustment of the joints of the body beyond the elastic

81	(i) assist the division in reviewing complaints concerning the unlawful or
82	unprofessional conduct of a licensee; and
83	(ii) advise the division in its investigation of these complaints.
84	(4) A board member who has, under Subsection (3), reviewed a complaint or advised
85	in its investigation may be disqualified from participating with the board when the board serves

as a presiding officer in an adjudicative proceeding concerning the complaint.
