General Description:
This bill expands veteran access to state parks.
Highlighted Provisions:
This bill:
 renumbers a provision that expands the State Parks Honor Pass Program to all veteran
with any percentage of disability rating from the Veterans Administration; and
 creates a one-year pilot program that expands free access to state parks on a limited
basis to veterans who have an Interagency Military-Lifetime Pass for national parks and are a
resident of the state.
