8	General Description:
9	This bill provides for supplemental English language arts instruction in public schools.
10	Highlighted Provisions:
11	This bill:
12	 defines terms;
13	 requires the State Board of Education to select one or more technology providers,
14	through a request for proposals process, to provide software licenses for an English
15	language arts instructional tool that meets certain criteria;
16	 provides for the distribution of the English language arts instructional tool licenses
17	to school districts and charter schools; and
18	 requires the State Board of Education to annually report testing data regarding the
19	English language arts instructional tool to the Education Interim Committee.

29	53A-1-712, Utah Code Annotated 1953

31	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
32	Section 1. Section 53A-1-712 is enacted to read:
33	53A-1-712. English language arts instructional tool.
34	(1) As used in this section:
35	(a) "Board" means the State Board of Education.
36	(b) "Lexile measure" means a unit of measurement that indicates the reading level of
37	readers and the difficulty of a text that can be used to appropriately align reading materials to
38	the level and comprehension rate of readers.
39	(c) "Licenses" means software licenses for a tool described in Subsection (2).
40	(2) On or before July 1, 2017, the board shall select one or more technology providers,
41	through a request for proposals process, to provide licenses for a supplemental tool for students
42	in grades Kindergarten through 12 that:
43	(a) enables student reading ability to be reported as a Lexile measure;
44	(b) uses Lexile measures to appropriately align reading materials and exercises to the
45	comprehension level of readers;
46	(c) includes activities designed to assess and improve:
47	(i) reading skills;
48	(ii) writing skills; and
49	(iii) vocabulary;
50	(d) is self-adapting to respond to the needs and progress of the learner, including
51	allowing for increasingly intense instruction and additional practice opportunities based on
52	individual student needs;
53	(e) provides opportunities for frequent and informal assessments and includes an
54	embedded progress monitoring tool and mechanisms for regular feedback to students and
55	teachers; and
56	(f) supplements and is aligned with state core curriculum standards related to English
57	language arts.
58	(3) The board may select one or more providers that provide a supplemental tool that

59	does not meet all the criteria described in Subsections (2)(a) through (f) if the board ensures
60	that the selected providers' supplemental tools collectively meet all the criteria described in
61	Subsections (2)(a) through (f).
62	(4) The board shall:
63	(a) solicit proposals from school districts and charter schools for the use of the
64	licenses; and
65	(b) make the licenses available to school districts and charter schools on a competitive
66	basis.
67	(5) (a) On or before November 1, 2018, and on or before November 1 each year
68	thereafter, the board shall report to the Education Interim Committee on the use of the tool
69	described in Subsection (2) to supplement and enhance English language arts instruction in
70	public schools.
71	(b) The board shall ensure that the report under Subsection (5)(a) includes student
72	learning gains on statewide achievement tests as a result of using the tool described in
73	Subsection (2).
74	Section 2. Appropriation.
75	The following sums of money are appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
76	2017, and ending June 30, 2018. These are additions to amounts previously appropriated for
77	fiscal year 2018. Under the terms and conditions of Utah Code Title 63J, Chapter 1, Budgetary
78	Procedures Act, the Legislature appropriates the following sums of money from the funds or
79	accounts indicated for the use and support of the government of the State of Utah.
80	To State Board of Education - Utah State Office of Education - Initiative Programs
81	From Education Fund \$1,000,000
82	Schedule of Programs:
83	English Language Arts Instructional Tool \$1,000,000
84	The Legislature intends that appropriations provided in this section are to be used as
85	provided in Section 53A-1-712.
86	Section 3. Effective date.
87	If approved by two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, this bill takes effect
88	upon approval by the governor, or the day following the constitutional time limit of Utah
89	Constitution, Article VII, Section 8, without the governor's signature, or in the case of a veto.
