| 22 | no appropriation would be made that year due to the economic impact of the Great Depression; |
| 23 | WHEREAS, two years later, the first state appropriation was made, and the state has |
| 24 | supported the growth and expansion of the college through the subsequent decades; |
| 25 | WHEREAS, in 2000, the Utah Legislature granted Dixie State College a name change |
| 26 | and baccalaureate degree status in recognition of its growth; |
| 27 | WHEREAS, during its 100th anniversary, Dixie State College is experiencing |
| 28 | ever-growing enrollment and the need to expand its educational offerings to meet the needs of |
| 29 | its community; |
