4. Title: Alcoholic beverage control; exemptions from licensure; manufacture of spirits.

5. Summary: This bill amends § 4.1-200 of the Code of Virginia, which allows licensure exemptions under the Alcoholic Beverage Control Act. This bill adds to the list of licensure exemptions, any person who, after being granted a permit by the Board of Directors of the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority pursuant to subdivision A 5 of § 4.1-212 (sets out when permits are required), manufactures at his residence for domestic consumption spirits in an amount not to exceed (i) 100 gallons per year if there are two or more persons 21 years of age or older residing in the residence or (ii) 50 gallons per year if there is only one person 21 years of age or older residing in the residence. The provision does not authorize the sale of such spirits.

8. Fiscal Implications: According to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority (ABC), the proposed bill is not expected to have a material fiscal impact on agency operations, nor is it expected to impact estimated profit transfers to the general fund.
