The bill also requires that prior to imposing a short-term suspension, a school division shall consider the use of in-school suspension in accordance with leveled administrative responses to student behavior as set out in the Department "Model Guidance for Positive, Preventative Code of Student Conduct Policy and Alternatives to Suspension" and any amendments thereto.
