4.	Title:	Electric Power-Assisted Bicycle Rebate Program					

- 5. Summary: Creates the Electric Power-Assisted Bicycle Rebate Program for the purchase of new electric power-assisted bicycles, as defined in the bill, to be administered by the Department of Energy. Under the bill, a purchaser of a new electric power-assisted bicycle would receive a \$500 rebate applied toward payment for the purchase, and a purchaser with an annual household income that does not exceed 300 percent of the federal poverty level would be entitled to an additional \$600 rebate for a new electric power-assisted bicycle. The bill provides for both rebates beginning January 1, 2025. Additional rebates are provided for in amounts of (i) up to \$100 for related equipment, (ii) \$300 for an electric power-assisted bicycle designed for carrying cargo, defined in the bill, and (iii) \$250 for an adaptive electric power-assisted bicycle, also defined in the bill.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This bill creates the Electric Power-Assisted Bicycle Rebate Program to be administered by the Department of Energy (DOE). The program would provide rebates to individuals who purchase electric power-assisted bicycles and electric power-assisted bicycle accessories. The Department anticipates that the workload required to manage the program will be equal to approximately 1 full time employee, or \$100,800 annually.

The bill directs DOE to "develop and implement a process for verifying eligible purchasers and participating retailers" and to establish a website for the program. It is anticipated that these provisions will require \$280,000 in the first year.
