**3. Committee:** Judiciary

**4. Title:**    Law-enforcement officers; protected personal information.

**5. Summary:** Provides that a law enforcement officer who provides information related to a criminal investigation or in criminal prosecution preliminary proceedings may refuse, unless ordered by a court, to disclose certain personal identifying information. He may also refuse to disclose personal information if he testifies as a witness in a criminal case unless it is determined by the court that such evidence is relevant to the case.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Preliminary. See Item 8 below.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** There is no anticipated fiscal impact on the Department of State Police, the Division of Capitol Police, the Office of the State Inspector General, or the Department of Corrections as a result of the provisions of this bill. Any potential fiscal impact on other agencies with law enforcement personnel is indeterminate at this time.

**9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected:** Department of State Police, Department of Motor Vehicles, Department of Corrections, Department of Juvenile Justice, Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority, Department of Conservation and Recreation, College and University Police Departments, Division of Capitol Police, Department of Wildlife Resources, Marine Resources Commission, Virginia Lottery, Office of the State Inspector General, Sheriff's offices, and local law enforcement agencies.
