**4. Title:**         Alcoholic beverage control; food-to-beverage ratio.

**5. Summary:** This bill defines and establishes how the term “food-to-beverage ratio” is calculated. The bill alters the current 45 percent food-to-beverage ratio for certain mixed beverage licensees, by requiring that a mixed beverage restaurant, caterer’s, or limited caterer’s licensee meet or exceed the following: (i) for such licensees with monthly food sales of at least \$4,000 but less than \$10,000, the food-to-beverage ratio would be 35 percent and (ii) for such licensees with monthly food sales of at least \$10,000, there would be no food-to-beverage ratio requirement imposed.
