16	or return the early voter absentee ballot mailed by the town clerk pursuant to
17	section 2530 of this title and who has requested an early voter absentee ballot
18	as provided in subchapter 6 of chapter 51 pursuant to section 2531 of this title.
19	(B) "Early voter" means any voter of the State who returns his or her
20	marked early voter absentee ballot, mailed by the town clerk pursuant to

1	section 2530 of this title, either prior to the election or to the polling place on
2	election day.
