7	petitions for guardianship of individuals with developmental disabilities
8	include a statement that the individual is at least 18 years of age or will be 18
9	years of age within six months of the filing date of the petition.

12	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
13	Sec. 1. 18 V.S.A. § 9305 is amended to read:
14	§ 9305. PETITION FOR GUARDIANSHIP
15	Any interested person with knowledge of the facts alleged may request the
16	State's Attorney having jurisdiction to file a petition with the Family Division
17	of the Superior Court alleging that person is developmentally disabled and in
18	need of guardianship. The State's Attorney shall file the petition unless it
19	clearly appears that the petition will be insufficient to support an action under

this chapter. The petition shall set forth:

1	(1) The the name, address, and telephone number of the interested
2	person who requested the filing of the petition, and the nature of his or her that
3	person's interest in the person alleged to have developmental disabilities;
4	(2) The the name, address, telephone number, and age of the respondent
5	and the name, address, and telephone number of any near relative of the
6	respondent and the name of any guardian or person holding a power of
7	attorney of the person;
8	(3) a statement indicating that the respondent is 18 years of age or older
9	or will be 18 years of age within six months of the filing date of the petition;
10	(4) The the reasons and the supporting facts why guardianship is
11	needed; and
12	(4)(5) The petition shall be limited to only information that is relevant to
13	the respondent's need for guardianship.
