11 12	An act relating to naming the State office building located at 133 State Street in Montpelier
13	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
14	Sec. 1. FINDINGS AND INTENT
15	(a) The General Assembly finds that:
16	(1) The building located at 133 State Street in Montpelier was purchased
17	by the State of Vermont in 1960 to be used for offices for a growing State
18	government.
19	(2) Philip Henderson Hoff was elected Governor of the State of
20	Vermont in 1962.

1	(3) Governor Hoff served as Governor for three terms during a period of
2	many changes in Vermont and the nation.
3	(4) Governor Hoff believed in a strong role for State government and
4	oversaw the expansion of State government services for the people of
5	Vermont.
6	(5) The first master plan for the Capital Complex, which included using
7	the building located at 133 State Street, was created in 1966 during Governor
8	Hoff's second term.
9	(6) Governor Hoff passed away on April 26, 2018.
10	(7) The building located at 133 State Street continues to house State
11	offices in the Capital Complex.
12	(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly to honor the late Governor Hoff
13	by naming the State office building located at 133 State Street in Montpelier
14	after him.
15	Sec. 2. 29 V.S.A. § 821(a) is amended to read:
16	(a) State buildings.
17	(1) "Asa Bloomer State Office Building" shall be the name of the
18	building now known as the "Hulett" office building in the city of Rutland.

20	(15) "Philip H. Hoff State Office Building" shall be the name of the
21	State office building at 133 State Street in Montpelier.
