14	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to expand the
15	appropriation, annual award, and eligibility for the 802 Opportunity Grant.

17	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
18	Sec. 1. 16 V.S.A. § 2845 is amended to read:
19	§ 2845. TRUST FUND; GRANTS; STUDENTS IN DEPARTMENT FOR
20	CHILDREN AND FAMILIES CUSTODY

BILL AS INTRODUCED 2023

1	(a) The Board shall establish a trust fund to be used to provide grants for
2	students who do not have parental support and are or have been under the
3	custody of the Commissioner for Children and Families. The Board may draw
4	up to 90 percent of the assets in the fund for these purposes.
5	(b) The trust fund shall consist of:
6	(1) funds appropriated by the General Assembly; and
7	(2) any gifts, grants, or contributions made to the trust fund.
8	(c) The Board may determine whether the trust fund is to be managed by
9	the State Treasurer or by a private firm contracted at the direction of the Board.
10	(d) Any amount remaining in the trust fund at the end of any fiscal year and
11	any interest accruing to the trust fund shall remain in the fund.
12	(e)(1) A child who is under the custody of the Commissioner for Children
13	and Families, or a young adult between the ages of 18 and 24 who was under
14	the custody of the Commissioner for Children and Families for at least six
15	months when that person was between the ages of 16 and 18, and who is
16	accepted for degree study at the Vermont State Colleges, the University of
17	Vermont, or a Vermont independent college, is eligible for an annual grant
18	under this section, to the extent that funds are available in the trust fund if the
19	child is:
20	(A) under the custody of the Commissioner for Children and
21	Families;

1	(B) a young adult between 18 and 24 years of age who was under the
2	custody of the Commissioner for Children and Families for at least six months
3	when that person was between 16 and 18 years of age; or
4	(C) a young adult between 18 and 24 years of age who was under the
5	permanent guardianship of a relative and received kinship assistance pursuant
6	to 33 V.S.A. § 4903 for at least six months when that person was between 16
7	and 18 years of age.
8	(2) Upon certification by the Vermont State Colleges, the University of
9	Vermont, or a Vermont independent college that a Vermont resident student
10	who is eligible under this section has matriculated in a degree program at a
11	Vermont college or university, the student may receive a grant if the student's
12	financial aid eligibility leaves remaining financial need following the student
13	and the family contributions, if any, and the availability of all other sources of
14	gift aid. Each grant, together with the student and the family contributions, if
15	any, and all other sources of gift aid, shall not exceed the full cost of tuition,
16	fees, room, and board, and no individual annual grant may exceed \$3,000.00
17	\$4,000.00. The Board may prorate the funds appropriated for use under this
18	section where the collective need of the eligible applicants exceeds the funds
19	appropriated. In addition, the Board may prorate a grant based on a student's
20	full- or part-time enrollment status.

BILL AS INTRODUCED 2023

1	(f) A person may receive a grant under this section for each of up to six
2	consecutive years. A young adult who receives a grant under this section prior
3	to reaching 25 years of age shall continue to be eligible for grants under this
4	section until six years from the date of matriculation or until he or she the
5	person has obtained an undergraduate degree, whichever comes first.
6	(g) The Board shall coordinate implementation of this section with the
7	Commissioner for Children and Families, the President of the Association of
8	Vermont Independent Colleges, the Chancellor of the Vermont State Colleges,
9	and the President of the University of Vermont. The Board may establish
10	procedures and policies or adopt rules to implement this section.
11	Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION; 802 OPPORTUNITY GRANT
12	In fiscal year 2024, \$150,000.00 is appropriated to the Vermont Student
13	Assistance Corporation in addition to the base appropriation for the 802
14	Opportunity Grant established in 16 V.S.A. § 2845.
