7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require the
8	Public Service Board to review the impacts of proposed wind energy
9	generation facilities on migratory birds before issuing a certificate of public
10	good. The bill also proposes to require that certificates of public good for such
11	facilities contain conditions to monitor bird mortality and establish a threshold
12	number of bird mortalities for each monitoring period which, if exceeded,
13	would result in a penalty.

1	(b) Before the public service board Public Service Board issues a certificate
2	of public good as required under subsection (a) of this section, it shall find that
3	the purchase, investment, or construction:

5	(12) with respect to a wind energy generation facility, will not have an
6	undue adverse effect on migratory birds, migratory bird habitat, and migratory
7	bird corridors.
8	* * *
9	(q) Unless granted under subsection (j) of this section (facilities of limited
10	size and scope), a certificate of public good issued under this section for an
11	in-state wind energy generation facility shall:
12	(1) require the post-construction monitoring of bird mortalities by a
13	qualified entity approved by the Agency of Natural Resources and paid for by
14	the person granted the certificate that follows current best practices in the
15	industry and lasts until the project no longer generates electricity; and
16	(2) set a threshold number of bird mortalities over the course of a
17	monitoring period, which if exceeded shall result in an imposition by the Board
18	of a \$100,000.00 penalty on the person granted the certificate for each
19	exceedance.
