Subject: Alcoholic Beverages; retail licenses and permits; retail delivery
permits; delivery by third party contractors

Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to allow the
holder of a second-class license and retail delivery permit to deliver malt
beverages and vinous beverages to consumers through an approved third-party
contractor.

An act relating to retail delivery of alcoholic beverages by third-party
contractors

It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

Sec. 1. 7 V.S.A. § 226 is amended to read:

§ 226. RETAIL DELIVERY PERMITS

* * *

1 (b) A retail delivery permit holder may deliver malt beverages and vinous
2 beverages sold from the licensed premises for consumption off the premises to
3 an individual who is 21 years of age or older subject to the following
4 requirements:

5 (1) Deliveries shall only be made by the permit holder, ~~or~~ an employee
6 of the permit holder, or a third-party delivery service that has been approved
7 by the Department.

8 * * *

9 (6) An employee or contractor of a third-party delivery service shall not
10 be permitted to make deliveries of malt beverages or vinous beverages on
11 behalf of the permit holder unless the third-party delivery service has been
12 approved by the Department and the employee or contractor has completed a
13 training program approved by the Division pursuant to section 213 of this
14 chapter.

16 This act shall take effect on July 1, 2021.
