9	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to make the
10	co-payment for a visit to a chiropractor or physical therapist the same as for a
11	visit to a primary care physician.

14	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
15	Sec. 1. 8 V.S.A. § 4088a(a) is amended to read:
16	(a) A health insurance plan shall provide coverage for clinically necessary
17	health care services provided by a chiropractic physician licensed in this State
18	for treatment within the scope of practice described in 26 V.S.A. chapter 10,
19	but limiting adjunctive therapies to physiotherapy modalities and rehabilitative

exercises. A health insurance plan does not have to provide coverage for the

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1 treatment of any visceral condition arising from problems or dysfunctions of 2 the abdominal or thoracic organs. A health insurer may require that the 3 chiropractic services be provided by a licensed chiropractic physician under 4 contract with the insurer or upon referral from a health care provider under 5 contract with the insurer. Health care services provided by chiropractic 6 physicians may be subject to reasonable deductibles, co-payment and 7 co-insurance amounts, fee or benefit limits, practice parameters and utilization 8 review consistent with any applicable regulations published by the Department 9 of Financial Regulation; provided that any such amounts, limits and review 10 shall not function to direct treatment in a manner unfairly discriminative 11 against chiropractic care, and collectively shall be no more restrictive than 12 those applicable under the same policy to care or services provided by other 13 health care providers but allowing for the management of the benefit consistent 14 with variations in practice patterns and treatment modalities among different 15 types of health care providers. Health care services provided by chiropractic 16 physicians may be subject to a co-payment that is no greater than the 17 co-payment applicable to care and services provided by a primary care 18 physician under the insured's policy. Nothing herein contained shall be 19 construed as impeding or preventing either the provision or coverage of health 20 care services by licensed chiropractic physicians, within the lawful scope of 21 chiropractic practice, in hospital facilities on a staff or employee basis.

8	(b) As used in this section, "health insurance plan" means any individual or
