Subject: Public safety; domestic animals; trespass; liability

Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to allow the  
owner of or a person in control of a domestic animal to enter onto the real  
property of another owner, including property posted against trespass or  
hunting, in order to retrieve a domestic animal that entered the property. An  
owner of or a person in control of a domestic animal would be held harmless  
for any damage or liability if the owner of or a person in control  
unintentionally allowed a domestic animal to enter the property of another  
owner, except for any damage caused by the domestic animal to the real  
property.
