12	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require that
13	all candidates for Adjutant and Inspector General shall have served in the
14	U.S. Armed Forces and have attained the rank of lieutenant colonel or above.
15 16	An act relating to the qualifications for candidates for Adjutant and Inspector General
17	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

1	Sec. 1. 2 V.S.A. § 12 is amended to read:
2	§ 12. LEGISLATIVE ELECTIONS; UNIFORM BALLOTS
3	(a) Whenever there is a known contested election for speaker of the house
4	of representatives Speaker of the House of Representatives, president pro
5	tempore of the senate President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and in elections by
6	the joint assembly of the legislature General Assembly, the secretary of state
7	Secretary of State shall prepare a ballot for each office, listing the names of the
8	known candidates for the office in the alphabetical order of their surnames and
9	leaving thereon sufficient blank spaces to take care of any nominations from
10	the floor.
11	(b) A candidate for office shall, not later than one week preceding the
12	election, notify the secretary of state Secretary of State in writing of his or her
13	candidacy, naming the particular office. If he or she fails so to notify the
14	secretary of state Secretary of State, his or her name shall not be printed on the
15	ballot. No ballot may be used other than the official ballot provided by the
16	secretary of state Secretary of State.
17	(c) A candidate for Adjutant and Inspector General must:
18	(1) be a resident of Vermont;
19	(2) have attained the rank of lieutenant colonel or above;

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1	(3) be a commissioned officer or former commissioned officer of the
2	U.S. Army, the U.S. Air Force, the U.S. Army Reserve, the U.S. Air Force
3	Reserve, the Army National Guard, or the Air National Guard;
4	(4) be a current member of the U.S. Armed Forces or eligible to be
5	recalled to active duty; and
6	(5) be a graduate of a Senior Service College or eligible to graduate
7	during the biennium in which the candidate would first be appointed.
8	Sec. 2. 20 V.S.A. § 363 is amended to read:
9	§ 363. OFFICERS GENERALLY
10	The general assembly General Assembly shall biennially elect an adjutant
11	and inspector general Adjutant and Inspector General, who shall also be
12	quartermaster general Quartermaster General with the rank of a major general.
13	Such officer A candidate for Adjutant and Inspector General shall have served
14	in the U.S. Armed Forces and attained the rank of lieutenant colonel or above.
15	The Adjutant and Inspector General may appoint a deputy with appropriate
16	rank, an assistant adjutant general for army Assistant Adjutant General for
17	Army, an assistant adjutant general for air Assistant Adjutant General for Air,
18	an assistant adjutant general for joint operations Assistant Adjutant General for
19	Joint Operations, a sergeant major Sergeant Major, and a chief master sergeant
20	Chief Master Sergeant, without pay, with the approval of the governor
21	Governor. The adjutant general Adjutant and Inspector General may remove

1	the appointed assistant adjutant generals Assistant Adjutant Generals and
2	sergeants and shall be responsible for their acts. Upon appointment, each
3	assistant adjutant general Assistant Adjutant General shall be a federally
4	recognized officer of the national guard National Guard of the rank of
5	lieutenant colonel or above, and shall have a rank of colonel or brigadier
6	general, and the sergeant major Sergeant Major shall be a federally recognized
7	noncommissioned officer of the national guard National Guard of the rank of
8	master sergeant or first sergeant, and the chief master sergeant Chief Master
9	Sergeant shall be a federally recognized noncommissioned officer of the rank
10	of senior master sergeant or first sergeant. The deputy, assistants, and
11	sergeants shall perform duties as the adjutant and inspector general and
12	quartermaster general Adjutant and Inspector General shall direct. In the
13	absence or disability of the officer, the deputy shall perform the duties of that
14	office. In case a vacancy occurs in the office of adjutant and inspector general
15	and quartermaster general Adjutant and Inspector General, the deputy shall
16	assume and discharge the duties of the office until the vacancy is filled. The
17	appointments shall be in writing and recorded in the office of the secretary of
18	state Office of the Secretary of State. All other officers of the national guard
19	National Guard shall be chosen in accordance with such regulations as the
20	governor Governor may prescribe consistent with the laws of this state State
21	and the United States.
