Sec. 3. DATA COLLECTION

- (a) On or before January 31, 2009, January 31, 2010 2013, and January 31, 2011 2015, the commissioner of the department for children and families shall report to the house committee on human services and the senate committee on health and welfare data for the preceding year two years regarding the transportation of children in the custody of the commissioner by a sheriff or deputy sheriff. The data shall include the number and gender of children transported to various locations and geographic distribution of the use of such transports.
- (b) On or before January 31, 2009, January 31, 2010 2013, and January 31, 2011 2015, the commissioner of the department of mental health shall report to the house committee on human services and the senate committee on health and welfare data for the preceding year two years regarding the transportation of persons in accordance with 18 V.S.A. § 7511. The data shall include the number, method, and location of all adult and child transports.
- (c) The department for children and families, the department of mental health, the department of corrections, the department of state's attorneys and sheriffs, the office of the defender general, and the court administrator's office shall meet to discuss protocols for the secure transport of children, persons being hospitalized for mental illness, and pregnant inmates who are in state custody and develop strategies for reducing the frequency and necessity of
