19	(a) Except as otherwise provided for in this section, the cost of each check
20	for a criminal history record as defined in section 2056a of this title or a

criminal conviction record as defined in section 2056c of this title based on
name and date of birth shall be \$30.00. Out-of-state criminal history record
checks shall include any additional fees charged by the state from which the
record is requested.
(b) Requests made by criminal justice agencies for criminal justice

- (b) Requests made by criminal justice agencies for criminal justice purposes or other purposes authorized by State or federal law shall be exempt from all record check fees. The following types of requests shall be exempt from the Vermont criminal record check fee:
- (1) Requests made by any individual, organization, or governmental body doing business in Vermont that has one or more individuals performing services for it within this State and is a qualified entity that provides care or services to children, elders, or persons with disabilities as defined in 42 U.S.C. § 5119c.
- (2) Requests made by researchers approved by the Vermont Crime Information Center to conduct research related to the administration of criminal justice. A fee, however, may be charged by the Center which shall reflect the cost of generating the requested information.
- (3) Requests made by individuals to review their own record at the Vermont Crime Information Center; however, copies of the individual's record are not exempt from the record check fee.

3	(5) Requests made by environmental enforcement officers employed by
