5	Subject: Study committee; budget; public participation pilot project
6	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to create a
7	public participation in budget development pilot project study committee.
8 9	An act relating to a study committee concerning public participation in the budget process
10	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
11	Sec. 1. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN BUDGET DEVELOPMENT PILOT
12	PROJECT STUDY COMMMITTEE
13	(a) Statement of purpose. The State of Vermont is committed, according to
14	32 V.S.A. § 306a, to enable direct and meaningful public participation in the
15	development of the State's budget and spending and revenue policy. The
16	budget process shall begin with direct public participation that informs budget
17	work in both the Executive and Legislative Branches. The participating public
18	shall review and recommend budget goals as well as specific spending and
19	revenue initiatives, and this process may include:

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1	(1) regional community meetings to develop proposals at which
2	delegates will be selected to work together to develop statewide
3	recommendations from the regional proposals;
4	(2) presentation of recommendations to the Governor and General
5	Assembly; and
6	(3) monitoring the extent that the recommendations are incorporated in
7	the budget.
8	(b) Creation of committee. There is created a Public Participation in
9	Budget Development Pilot Project Study Committee.
10	(c) Membership. The Committee shall be composed of seven members.
11	Four members shall be members of the General Assembly. Two members
12	shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, not from
13	the same political party. Two members shall be appointed by the Committee
14	of Committees of the Senate, not from the same political party. Three
15	members shall be appointed by the Governor, and these members shall have
16	experience in strengthening public participation and civic engagement.
17	(d) Powers and duties. The Committee shall:
18	(1) develop a process of public participation in the development of the
19	budget that includes community meetings in two planning regions of the State.
20	The purpose of these meetings shall be to recommend budget goals and review,
21	propose, and prioritize state spending and revenue initiatives;

(2) hold a minimum of one community meeting in each region. This	
meeting will be facilitated by the Vermont Council on Rural Development in	
the first year, and the community meeting will appoint a facilitator for the	
subsequent year. One delegate for each region shall be appointed by the	
community meeting to reconcile budget and revenue proposals between the	
regions by August 1 of each year and present proposals to the Governor and	
General Assembly;	
(3) request revenue estimates, needs assessments, and other budget	
information from the Governor and other public entities as needed;	
(4) develop a method for monitoring the consideration of public	
proposals in the budget process and final budget;	
(5) develop an outreach strategy to reduce barriers to participation in	
this process and facilitate broad access to information and meetings;	
(6) ensure that community meetings are inclusive and adequately	
supported to enable the participation of people from marginalized and	
vulnerable communities;	
(7) develop a framework for incorporating the principles of universality,	
equity, and dignity, as expressed in 32 V.S.A. § 306a, into the facilitation of	
the meetings, as well as into the proposal of budget measures to account for the	
scope and severity of need.	

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1	(e) Reports. The Pilot Project Committee shall produce two reports:
2	(1) By January 15, 2014, the Committee shall report to the General
3	Assembly on the status of the public participation process, and this report shall
4	include:
5	(A) an explanation of the methodology and processes developed,
6	including measures taken for facilitating the incorporation of public proposals
7	in the Governor's budget proposal;
8	(B) an assessment of barriers to participation and barriers to the
9	uptake of public proposals;
10	(C) an analytical framework for incorporating the principles of
11	universality, equity, and dignity, as expressed in 32 V.S.A. § 306a, in the
12	participation process; and
13	(D) guidance for preparing and publishing an accessible and
14	easy-to-understand version of the budget and related information.
15	(2) By January 15, 2014, the Committee shall report to the General
16	Assembly on the status of the public participation process, and this report shall
17	include:
18	(A) an evaluation of the pilot projects;
19	(B) proposals for expanding or revising the methodology and
20	frameworks outlined in the first report;
21	(C) a plan of action for continuing the pilots on a permanent basis
22	and expanding them to all regions; and

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1	(D) a cost estimate for establishing and maintaining a continuous
2	participation process in all regions.
3	(f) Term; number of meetings; reimbursement. The Committee shall exist
4	for two years and shall cease to exist on January 15, 2015. The Committee
5	shall meet not more than a total of 12 times. For attendance at meetings during
6	adjournment of the General Assembly, legislative members of the Committee
7	shall be entitled to compensation and reimbursement for expenses as provided
8	in 2 V.S.A. § 406; and other members of the Committee who are not
9	employees of the State of Vermont shall be reimbursed at the per diem rate set
10	in 32 V.S.A. § 1010.
11	(g) Appropriation. The sum of \$8,000.00 is appropriated from the General
12	Fund in fiscal year 2014 for per diem and expenses under this section.
13	Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE

This act shall take effect on July 1, 2013.
