services. Advertisements include business cards, letterhead, patient brochures,

e-mail templates, websites, social media Internet presence, audio, video, and
any other communication or statement used in the ordinary course of business.
(2) "Deceptive" or "misleading" means any information used in an
advertisement or made in an affirmative communication or representation for
health care services that misstates, falsely describes, or falsely represents the
health care professional's license type, education, skills, training, expertise,
education, licensure, certification, registration, or board certification.
(3) "Director" means the director of the office of professional
regulation.
(4) "Health care professional" shall have the same meaning as the term
"health care provider" as defined in 18 V.S.A. § 9402 and includes a podiatrist,
chiropractor, dentist, dental hygienist, medical doctor, nurse, nursing assistant,
advanced practice registered nurse (including a nurse practitioner, certified
nurse midwife, nurse anesthetist, and clinical nurse specialist), optometrist,
anesthesiologist assistant, physician assistant, osteopathic physician,
pharmacist, physical therapist, optician, radiologist assistant, occupational
therapist, occupational therapy assistant, dietitian, acupuncturist, naturopathic
physician, athletic trainer, midwife, respiratory care practitioner, radiologic

technologist, pharmacy technician, physical therapist assistant, psychologist,

3	(5) "Regulatory entity" means the board, office, or department

6	(a) An advertisement for health care services shall identify the type of
7	license, certification, or registration held by the health care professional who is
8	advertising or who is referenced in the advertisement. The advertisement shall
9	be consistent with the definitions, titles, and initials the health care professional
10	is authorized or required to use under his or her regulatory law. The
11	advertisement shall be free from any and all deceptive or misleading
12	information.
13	(b)(1) A health care professional providing health care services in Vermont
14	shall include the health care professional's type of license, certification, or
15	registration in notices, forms, or other handouts presented to patients,
16	prospective patients, or patient representatives. Information about the type of
17	license, certification, or registration shall be placed prominently on the handou
18	and shall be of sufficient size so as to be readily readable to patients.
19	(2) A health care professional who works exclusively in nonpatient care
20	settings and who does not have any direct patient care interactions shall not be

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2	(a) Failure to comply with any provision of this chapter shall constitute
3	unprofessional conduct pursuant to a health care professional's regulatory law.
4	(b) At its discretion, a regulatory entity may inspect and audit a health care
5	professional's records and office to determine compliance with the
6	transparency requirements set forth in section 1502 of this title.
7	(c) The attorney general shall investigate any complaints against a health
8	care professional alleged to have deceived or misled a patient or the public by
9	holding himself or herself out as practicing a profession that he or she is not

13	Sec. 2. ADOPTION OF RULES REGARDING IDENTIFICATION TAGS
14	(a) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, by January 1, 2014,
15	the office of professional regulation and the department of health shall adopt
16	rules requiring health care professionals regulated by them to wear photo
17	identification tags disclosing the professional's license, certification, or
18	registration type to patients, prospective patients, and patient representatives.
19	(1) The photo identification tag shall include a recent photograph of the
20	health care professional, the professional's name, and the professional's title
21	and the license, certification, or registration type.

1	(2) The title of the health care professional shall be as large as possible
2	in block type and shall occupy a one-half-inch-tall strip as close as practicable
3	to the bottom edge of the identification tag.
4	(3)(A) The license types set forth in this subdivision shall have the
5	following titles:
6	(i) A medical doctor shall have the title "Physician."
7	(ii) A doctor of osteopathy shall have the title "Physician."
8	(iii) A registered nurse shall have the title "Registered Nurse."
9	(iv) A licensed practical nurse shall have the title "Licensed
10	Practical Nurse."
11	(B) For every other health care professional not identified in
12	subdivision (3)(A) of this subsection (a), the regulatory entity shall determine
13	the title required to be used for the purposes of this subsection.
14	(b) The rules adopted pursuant to subsection (a) of this section shall
15	specifically authorize a regulatory entity, at its discretion, to inspect and audit a
16	health care professional's office to determine compliance with the
17	identification tag requirements of subsection (a) of this section.
18	(c) The rules adopted pursuant to subsection (a) of this section shall
19	specifically exempt from the identification tag requirements set forth in
20	subsection (a) a health care professional who works exclusively in nonpatient
21	care settings and who does not have any direct patient care interactions.
