10	(a) A motor vehicle shall not be operated upon a highway of this state

equipped with a siren or signal lamp colored other than amber unless a permit

authorizing this equipment, issued by the commissioner of motor vehicles

1	pursuant to section 1252 of this title, is carried in the vehicle. A permit may be
2	transferred following the same procedure and subject to the same time limits as
3	set forth in section 321 of this title. The commissioner may adopt additional
4	rules as may be required to govern the acquisition of permits and the use
5	pertaining to sirens and colored signal lamps.
6	(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a) of this section, when
7	responding to emergencies, law enforcement vehicles, ambulances, fire
8	department vehicles, or vehicles owned or leased by, or provided to, volunteer
9	firefighters or rescue squad members which are registered or licensed by
10	another state or province may use sirens and signal lamps in Vermont, and a
11	permit shall not be required for such use, as long as the vehicle is properly
12	permitted in its home state or province.

15	LAMPS OR BOTH; USE OF SIRENS AND LAMPS
16	(a) When Upon application and when satisfied as to the condition and use
17	of the vehicle, the commissioner shall issue and may revoke, for cause, permits
18	for <u>authorizing use of</u> sirens or colored signal lamps in the following manner <u>as</u>

(1) Sirens or blue or blue and white signal lamps, or a combination of

these, may be authorized for all law enforcement vehicles, owned or leased by

- a law enforcement agency or a certified law enforcement officer and if. If the applicant is a constable, the application shall be accompanied by a certification by the town clerk that the applicant is the duly elected or appointed constable and attesting that the town has not voted to limit the constable's authority to engage in enforcement activities under 24 V.S.A. § 1936a. In addition, one blue signal lamp may be authorized for use on a municipal fire department vehicle in accordance with subsection (c) of this section.
- (2) Sirens and red or red and white signal lamps <u>may be authorized</u> for all ambulances, fire <u>apparatus</u> <u>department vehicles</u>, vehicles <u>used solely in</u> <u>rescue operations</u>, or <u>vehicles</u> owned or leased by, or provided to, volunteer <u>firemen firefighters</u> and voluntary rescue squad members, including a vehicle owned by a volunteer's employer when the volunteer has the written authorization of the employer to use the vehicle for emergency fire or rescue activities <u>and motor vehicles used solely in rescue operations</u>.
- (3) No vehicle may be authorized Except in the case of municipal fire department vehicles, the commissioner shall not issue a permit for more than one of the combinations described in subdivisions (1) and (2) of this subsection.
- (4) Notwithstanding subdivisions (1) and (2) of this subsection, no No motor vehicle, other than one owned by the applicant, shall be issued a permit until such time as the commissioner can adequately record the has recorded

1	information regarding both the owner of the vehicle and the applicant for the
2	permit.
3	(5) Upon application to the commissioner, the commissioner may issue
4	a single permit for all the vehicles owned or leased by the applicant.
5	(b) Amber signal lamps shall be used on road maintenance vehicles, service
6	vehicles, and wreckers when being used for maintenance, service, or towing,
7	and shall be used on all registered snow removal equipment when in use
8	removing snow on public highways and the. The amber lamps shall be
9	mounted so as to be visible from all sides of the motor vehicle. A vehicle
10	equipped with an amber signal lamp may not be issued a permit for the
11	installation and use of a siren.
12	(c) If a municipal fire department vehicle is authorized to display a blue
13	signal lamp pursuant to subdivision (a)(1) of this section, the lamp shall be
14	mounted so as to be visible primarily from the rear of the vehicle.
