7	Statement of purpose: This bill proposes to reduce the information required to
8	be filed with the board of dental examiners or the board of medical practice in
9	order for a dentist, dental hygienist, or physician licensed in New Hampshire to
10	obtain pro bono licensure in Vermont.
11 12	An act relating to the pro bono licensure of dentists, dental hygienists, and physicians who are licensed in New Hampshire
13	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

17	(a) In its discretion, upon a satisfactory practical examination

demonstrating his or her proficiency, the board may issue a license to a dentist

who has been lawfully in practice in another state for at least five years, upon

the payment of the required fee, if the applicant presents a certificate from the

board of dental examiners or other like board of the state in which he or she has practiced, certifying to competency and good moral character.

- (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a) of this section and any other provision of law, a dentist or dental hygienist who holds an unrestricted license in all jurisdictions in which the dentist or dental hygienist is currently licensed, who certifies to the Vermont board of dental examiners that he or she will limit his or her practice in Vermont to providing pro bono services at a free or reduced fee clinic in Vermont and who meets the criteria of the board, shall be licensed by the board within 60 days of the licensee's certification without further examination, interview, fee or any other requirement for board licensure. The dentist or dental hygienist shall file with the board, on forms provided by the board and based on criteria developed by the board, information on dental qualifications, professional discipline, criminal record, malpractice claims or any other such information as the board may require. A license granted under this subsection shall authorize the licensee to practice dentistry or dental hygiene on a voluntary basis in Vermont.
- (c) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections (a) and (b) of this section and any other provision of law, a dentist or dental hygienist who holds an unrestricted license in New Hampshire, who certifies to the Vermont board of dental examiners that he or she will limit his or her practice in Vermont to providing pro bono services at a free or reduced fee clinic in Vermont, and

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who meets the criteria of the board shall be licensed by the board within 60
days of the licensee's certification without further examination, interview, fee,
or any other requirement for board licensure. The dentist or dental hygienist
shall file with the board proof of current license from New Hampshire and a
letter of good standing from the regulatory body within that state that has the
authority to certify good standing. A license granted under this subsection
shall authorize the licensee to practice dentistry or dental hygiene on a
voluntary basis in Vermont.

§ 1395. LICENSE WITHOUT EXAMINATION
(a) Without examination the board may, upon payment of the required fee,
issue a license to a reputable physician who personally appears and presents a
certified copy of a certificate of registration or a license issued to him or her in
a jurisdiction whose requirements for registration are deemed by the board as
equivalent to those of this state, providing that such jurisdiction grants the
same reciprocity to a Vermont physician or by the National Board of Medical
Examiners.

(c) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a) of this section and any

other provision of law, a physician who holds an unrestricted license in all

1 jurisdictions where the physician is currently licensed, and who certifies to the 2 Vermont board of medical practice that he or she will limit his or her practice in Vermont to providing pro bono services at a free or reduced fee health care 3 4 clinic in Vermont and who meets the criteria of the board, shall be licensed by 5 the board within 60 days of the licensee's certification without further 6 examination, interview, fee, or any other requirement for board licensure. The physician shall file with the board proof of current license from New Hampshire, a letter of good standing from 21

1	the regulatory body within that state that has the authority to certify good
2	standing, and a letter from the Veterans Administration Hospital in Hartford,
3	Vermont or the Alice Peck Day Memorial Hospital or Dartmouth Hitchcock
4	Memorial Center in Lebanon, New Hampshire stating that the physician is
5	credentialed at that hospital. A license granted under this subsection shall
6	authorize the licensee to practice medicine on a voluntary basis in Vermont.
