10	(e) <u>The Court may conduct an in camera discussion with the child to assist</u>

14	jurisdiction as provided in that act. For the purposes of interpreting that act
15	and any other provision of law which refers to a custodial parent, including
16	13 V.S.A. § 2451, the parent with physical responsibility shall be considered
17	the custodial parent.
