6	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require high
7	school driver education instruction on (i) different forms of transit and how
8	these forms of transit may be used in combination to reach a destination; (ii)
9	emerging technologies in the field of transit, such as electric and hybrid
10	vehicles; and (iii) the rights and responsibilities of nonvehicle users of public
11	roads and how to interact safely and respectfully with these other users.

13	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
14	Sec. 1. 16 V.S.A. § 1045 is amended to read:
15	§ 1045. DRIVER TRAINING COURSE
16	(a) A driver education and training course, approved by the Agency of
17	Education and the Department of Motor Vehicles, shall be made available to
18	students whose parent or guardian is a resident of Vermont and who have
19	reached their 15th birthday and who are regularly enrolled in a public or
20	independent high school approved by the State Board.

1	(b) After June 30, 1984, all All driver education courses shall include:
2	(1) a course of instruction, approved by the State Board and the council
3	on the effects of alcohol and drugs on driving-;
4	(c)(2) All driver education courses shall include instruction on motor
5	vehicle liability insurance and the motor vehicle financial responsibility laws
6	of the State-:
7	(d)(3) All driver education courses shall include instruction on the
8	adverse environmental, health, economic, and other effects of unnecessary
9	idling of motor vehicles and on the law governing prohibited idling of motor
10	vehicles;
11	(4) instruction on the availability and advantages and disadvantage of
12	different forms of transit, such as buses, planes, trains, bicycles, and walking,
13	and how these forms of transit may be used in combination to reach a
14	destination;
15	(5) instruction on emerging technologies in the field of transit, such as
16	electric and hybrid vehicles; and
17	(6) instruction on the rights and responsibilities of nonvehicle users of
18	public roads, such as people walking or using bicycles or scooters, and on how
19	to interact safely and respectfully with these other users.
