11	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to designate
12	Hericium Americanum, commonly known as the bear's head tooth mushroom,
13	as the State Mushroom.
14	An act relating to designating a State Mushroom
15	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
16	Sec. 1. FINDINGS
17	The General Assembly finds:
18	(1) Vermont does not yet have a State Mushroom, despite having a State
19	Vegetable, a State Bird, a State Tree, and other State symbols.

1	(2) Learning about, identifying, and foraging for mushrooms is a hobby
2	that thousands of young and old Vermonters enjoy and allows Vermonters to
3	spend time in the State's natural environment.
4	(3) Designating a State Mushroom recognizes the unique and delightful
5	treasures that exist in our State woods.
6	(4) The bear's head tooth mushroom has been voted on and
7	recommended by two southern Vermont schools because it is a unique but
8	easy-to-identify mushroom with nutritional and medicinal qualities.
9	Sec. 2. 1 V.S.A. § 520 is added to read:
10	§ 520. STATE MUSHROOM
11	The State Mushroom shall be Hericium Americanum, commonly known as
12	the bear's head tooth mushroom.
