6 (b) For purposes of this section, a school district which provides, furnishes 7 and maintains a program of education for the first eight years of compulsory 8 school attendance shall be obligated to pay tuition for its pupils for at least four 9 additional years A district that maintains a public high school shall pay tuition 10 pursuant to this chapter to a public high school, an approved independent high 11 school, or an independent school meeting school quality standards, to be 12 selected by the parents or guardians of the pupil, within or outside the state. 13 (c) The school board may both maintain a high school and furnish high 14 school education by paying tuition to a public school as in the judgment of the 15 board may best serve the interests of the pupils, or to an approved independent 16 school or an independent school meeting school quality standards if the board 17 judges that a pupil has unique educational needs that cannot be served within 18 the district or at a nearby public school.
