8	Statement of purpose: This bill proposes to classify a cosmetologist who rents
9	a booth at a salon as an employee of the salon unless it can be shown that the
10	salon has no right to control the methodology used by the cosmetologist to
11	produce a result and that the cosmetologist pays the salon either a fixed
12	percentage of his or her gross receipts or a flat fee.
13	An act relating to employment of cosmetologists
14	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
15	Sec. 1. 26 V.S.A. § 290 is added to read:
16	§ 290. EMPLOYMENT OF COSMETOLOGISTS; INDEPENDENT
17	CONTRACTORS
18	(a) A licensed cosmetologist who rents a booth at a salon shall be deemed
19	to be an employee of the salon unless:

1	(1) A written agreement exists between the cosmetologist and the salon
2	specifying that the cosmetologist is an independent contractor.
3	(2) The salon has no right to control the methodology used by the
4	cosmetologist to produce a given result.
5	(3) The amount of rent to be paid by the cosmetologist to the salon is
6	either calculated at a fixed percentage of the cosmetologist's gross receipts or
7	is a flat fee.
8	(b) The salon shall maintain records of all rental payments made to it and
9	all distributions made to the cosmetologist.
