4	Subject: Internal security and public safety; national guard
5	Statement of purpose: This bill proposes to give the adjutant general the
6	authority to create medals and awards to recognize meritorious service. The
7	bill allows a court to stay a civil or administrative proceeding during the time a
8	Vermont National Guard member is on state active duty. The bill clarifies that
9	a guard member is allowed to take unpaid leave from work during a period of
10	state active duty. The bill also allows members of the guard to continue their
11	civilian health insurance when called to state active duty, and clarifies the law
12	regarding the receipt of educational assistance.
13	An act relating to the national guard
14	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
15	Sec. 1. 20 V.S.A. § 946 is added to read:
16	<u>§ 946. NONJUDICIAL PUNISHMENT</u>
17	Any commander of the national guard, not in the service of the United
18	States, may, in addition to or in lieu of admonition or reprimand, impose
19	nonjudicial punishment in like manner and to the extent prescribed by
20	Article 15 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice, Manual for Courts-Martial,
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1	United States, as shall be currently in use by the armed forces of the United
2	States, except that there shall be no right to demand trial by courts-martial
3	when the commander notifies the accused prior to accepting the nonjudicial
4	punishment that the maximum punishment to be considered in the event that
5	the accused is found guilty will be the loss of one rank, restriction, extra duty,
6	oral admonition or reprimand, or written reprimand.

8	<u>§ 369. AWARDS</u>
9	Upon the approval of the governor, the adjutant general may, from time to
10	time, create and design such awards and medals to recognize meritorious
11	service or outstanding achievement for members of the Vermont National
12	Guard. The adjutant general will cause to be published a roster of these awards
13	and medals, the criteria and process for awarding them, and a description or
14	specification of the award and medals. All awards and medals will be
15	presented in the name of the state of Vermont and be awarded to a member or
16	retired member of the Vermont National Guard or if the member is deceased to
17	the member's spouse, child, parent, sibling, or grandchild.

19	§ 603. ARMS AND EQUIPMENT; PAY AND RATIONS
20	When the national guard, or part thereof, is ordered out under the provisions
21	of section 366, 601, or 602 of this title, the state shall furnish arms and

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1	equipment necessary for each officer, warrant officer, and enlisted person; and
2	they shall be entitled to pay and rations pay, subsistence, and quarters
3	allowance equivalent to that paid to members of the armed forces of the United
4	States for officers, warrant officers, and enlisted persons of corresponding
5	grade and time in service as designated in the U.S. pay tables.

8	If any member of the Vermont national guard is ordered to state active duty
9	by the governor, the service member shall have the right to take leave without
10	pay from his or her civilian employment. No member of the national guard
11	shall be forced to use or exhaust his or her vacation or other accrued leave
12	from his or her civilian employment for a period of active service.

16	(a)(1) If a service member of the Vermont National Guard who is ordered
17	to state active duty by the governor is a party to a civil or administrative
18	proceeding in any Vermont court, the proceeding:
19	(A) may be stayed by the court on its own motion; or
20	(B) shall be stayed by application of the member or person acting on
21	behalf of the member, unless the court finds that the proceeding would not be

1	materially affected by reason of the member's absence, or that the member can
2	participate by telephone or other electronic means.
3	(2) A motion for a stay under this subsection may be filed, or the court
4	may issue such a stay, at any time during the period of active service. Any
5	stay issued shall not remain in effect for more than 30 days after the
6	completion of state active duty.
7	(b) An application for a stay pursuant to subdivision (a)(1)(B) of this
8	section shall include:
9	(1) a letter or other communication setting forth facts stating the manner
10	in which the member's duty requirements materially affect the member's
11	ability to appear and stating a date when the member will be available to
12	appear; and
13	(2) a letter or other communication from the member's commanding
14	officer stating that the member's current military duty prevents the member
15	from appearing and that military leave is not authorized for the member at the
16	time of the letter.
17	(c) This section shall not apply to:
18	(1) proceedings involving relief from abuse orders under 15 V.S.A.
19	chapter 21, subchapter 1;
20	(2) proceedings involving orders against stalking or sexual assault under
21	<u>12 V.S.A. chapter 178;</u>

1	(3) proceedings involving abuse prevention orders for vulnerable adults
2	under 33 V.S.A. chapter 69, subchapter 1; or
3	(4) civil operator's license suspension proceedings under 23 V.S.A.

6	§ 492. RIGHTS AND BENEFITS

8	(c)(1) If any member of the Vermont National Guard with civilian
9	employer-sponsored insurance coverage is ordered to state active duty by the
10	governor for up to 30 days, the service member may, at the member's option,
11	continue his or her civilian health insurance under the same terms and
12	conditions as were in effect for the month preceding the member's call to state
13	active duty, including a continuation of the same levels of employer and
14	employee contributions toward premiums and cost-sharing.
15	(2) If a member of the Vermont National Guard is called to state active
16	duty for more than 30 days, the member may continue his or her civilian health
17	insurance. For a member whose employer chooses not to continue regular
18	contributions toward premiums and cost-sharing during the period of the
19	member's state active duty in excess of 30 days, the state of Vermont shall be
20	responsible for paying the employer's share of the premium and cost-sharing.

1	(3) The department of labor shall administer this subsection and shall
2	adopt rules pursuant to 3 V.S.A. chapter 25 to carry out the purposes of this
3	subsection, including developing employee notice requirements, enforcement
4	provisions, and a process for the state to remit the employer's share of
5	premiums and cost-sharing to the appropriate entities pursuant to
6	subdivision (2) of this subsection.

11	(1) <u>"Vermont National guard Guard"</u> as used in this section will be
12	deemed to include Vermont army national guard and Vermont air national
13	guard.
14	(2) <u>"Active duty for national guard Vermont National Guard</u> and for
15	active reserve forces" means full-time duty in the active military service of the
16	United States and includes full-time training duty, annual training duty, and
17	attendance, while in the active military service, at a school designated as a

9	(a) An active member of the Vermont army national guard or the air
10	national guard National Guard may be eligible for an interest-free loan in an
11	academic year for financial assistance to pay for tuition and fees for courses
12	taken at a Vermont college, university, regional technical center, or other
13	programs approved pursuant to policies adopted in accordance with subsection
14	(f) of this section. Academic year awards may be up to the in state tuition rate
15	at the University of Vermont for that year.
16	(b) To be eligible for an educational loan under this section, a person shall:
17	(1) be an active member in good standing of a federally recognized
18	federally recognized unit of the Vermont army national guard or air national
19	guard National Guard;
20	(2) have successfully completed basic training or commissioning; and
21	(3) not hold a baccalaureate degree or higher; and

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1	(4) be enrolled in a program that leads to a postsecondary degree,
2	diploma or be studying for relevant continuing education purposes.
3	(c) A loan made under this section shall be interest free and may be
4	partially or completely cancelled and forgiven for a person who:
5	(1) submits certification that the person has successfully completed the
6	course; and
7	(2) submits certification that the person has completed two years of
8	national guard service for each full academic year award. Service
9	requirements for less than a full academic year award shall be proportionate to
10	the amount of the award. The board shall determine the amount of loan to be
11	cancelled for each completed year of service. The amount cancelled for each
12	year of service shall not exceed 50 percent of the loan.
13	(d) The adjutant general shall provide a certificate documentation of
14	eligibility to each person who has been found to be eligible for educational
15	assistance under this section for each academic period. The certificate shall be
16	valid for one academic year.
17	(e) A person shall not be eligible for educational assistance under this
18	section for any courses taken after he or she has been awarded a baccalaureate
19	degree or is no longer an active member in good standing of the Vermont army
20	national guard or the air national guard The loan of a person who loses
21	eligibility under this section while enrolled in a course shall go into repayment

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1	pursuant to the terms of the loan, and the person shall be ineligible for further
2	assistance under this section until the loan is repaid in full.
3	(f) The board, in consultation with the office of the adjutant general, shall
4	adopt rules policies, procedures, and guidelines necessary to implement the
5	provisions of this section, which shall include application requirements, annual
6	loan requirements, loan forgiveness requirements, and annual loan amounts
7	based on available funds. Rules The policies, procedures, and guidelines shall
8	include definitions of "successful completion of a course," "relevant
9	continuing education courses" and what constitutes an "academic year." Rules
10	adopted by the Vermont state colleges State Colleges under section 2183 of
11	this title, prior to its repeal, shall remain valid under this section and shall be
12	administered by the corporation.
