11	access the database to obtain relevant data; and to require licensed midwives to

- (c) A health insurance plan may require that the maternity services be provided by a licensed midwife or certified nurse midwife under contract with the plan.
- (d) As used in this section, "health insurance plan" means any health insurance policy or health benefit plan offered by a health insurer, as defined in 18 V.S.A. § 9402, as well as Medicaid, the Vermont health access plan, and any other public health care assistance program offered or administered by the state or by any subdivision or instrumentality of the state. The term shall not include policies or plans providing coverage for specific disease or other limited benefit coverage.

2	(a) Notwithstanding 8 V.S.A. § 4099d(c), until July 1, 2014, for home birth
3	services to be provided by a licensed midwife or a certified nurse midwife, a
4	health insurance plan shall not:
5	(1) require that the licensed midwife or certified nurse midwife be under
6	contract with the plan or participate in the plan's network; or
7	(2) offer a plan that only covers midwifery services provided by a
8	licensed midwife or certified nurse midwife when a network provider is used.

11	Sec. 8. DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH; REPORTING REQUIREMENT
12	(a) The department of health licensed midwives appointed as advisors to
13	the office of professional regulation pursuant to 26 V.S.A. § 4186 shall access
14	the database maintained by the Division of Research of the Midwives Alliance
15	of North America to obtain information relating to care provided in Vermont
16	by midwives licensed pursuant to 26 V.S.A. chapter 85 of Title 26 and by
17	advanced practice registered nurses licensed pursuant to 26 V.S.A. chapter 28
18	of Title 26 who are certified as nurse midwives. The advisor appointees shall
19	provide the full aggregate data available from the database to the commissioner
20	of health by February 15 of each year from 2012 through 2016, inclusive, to

1	enable the commissioner or designee to comply with subsection (b) of this
2	section.
3	(b) No later than March 15 of each year from 2012 through 2016, inclusive
4	the commissioner of health or designee, in collaboration with the director of

15	Sec. 5. EFFECTIVE DATES
16	(a) Sec. 1 of this act shall take effect on October 1, 2012, and shall apply to
17	all health insurance plans and health benefit plans on and after October 1,
18	2012, on such date as a health insurer issues, offers, or renews the plan, but in
19	no event later than October 1, 2013.
20	(b) The remaining sections of this act shall take effect on passage.
