6	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to create a
7	provisional alcohol license that will permit an individual between 18 and 21
8	years of age to consume a limited amount of alcoholic beverages provided the
9	individual is accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.
10	An act relating to provisional alcohol licenses
11	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
12	Sec. 1. 7 V.S.A. § 602a is added to read:
13	§ 602a. ALCOHOL USE BY INDIVIDUALS 18 YEARS OF AGE OR
14	OLDER; PROVISIONAL ALCOHOL LICENSE; REQUIRED
15	<u>EDUCATION</u>
16	(a) The Commissioner of Liquor Control may grant a provisional alcohol
17	license to an individual who satisfies the following requirements:
18	(1) Is at least 18 years of age, but not yet 21 years of age.
19	(2) Has completed his or her secondary education.

1	(3) Is a Vermont resident or a full-time student enrolled at a college or
2	university located in Vermont.
3	(4) Has completed a 40-hour alcohol education course designed and
4	conducted by the Department or by a person whom the Department has
5	certified to conduct the course. The Department may establish a fee for the
6	course that is sufficient to cover the actual cost of providing the course.
7	(5) Has paid the license fee pursuant to section 231 of this title.
8	(b)(1) A provisional alcohol license issued pursuant to this section shall
9	permit the licensee to purchase, possess, or consume alcoholic beverages at an
10	establishment that holds a first- or first- and third-class license, or in a private
11	residence provided the individual is accompanied by or in the presence of the
12	individual's parent or legal guardian.
13	(2) The holder of a first- or first-and third-class license shall be
14	permitted to serve the holder of a provisional alcohol license a total of no more
15	than 16 ounces of malt beverage, four ounces of vinous beverage, or two
16	ounces of spirits or fortified wine.
17	(c) An individual who has violated section 656, 657, or 657a of this title
18	shall not be permitted to obtain a provisional alcohol license for a period 12
19	months from his or her 18th birthday for each violation. Nothing in this
20	subsection shall be construed to prevent an individual from purchasing

1	possessing, or consuming alcoholic beverages as otherwise permitted by this
2	title upon reaching 21 years of age.
3	(d)(1)(A) When the Department grants an alcohol license to an individual,
4	the Department of Motor Vehicles shall issue a provisional alcohol license to
5	the individual upon submission of valid photographic identification and written
6	approval for the license provided by the Department.
7	(B) A provisional alcohol license shall contain the licensee's name,
8	date of birth, gender, address, and signature, a unique identification number, a
9	full facial photograph, and the issuance and expiration dates in a form
10	approved by the Department.
11	(2) A provisional alcohol license issued pursuant to this subsection shall
12	expire when the licensee reaches 21 years of age.
13	(3) A provisional alcohol license shall be revoked if the licensee is
14	determined to have violated any laws relating to the purchase, possession, or
15	consumption of alcoholic beverages set forth in this title or Title 23.
16	Revocation of a provisional alcohol license shall not affect an individual's
17	right to purchase, possess, or consume alcoholic beverages when the individual
18	reaches 21 years of age.

5	An individual shall exhibit "a valid authorized form of identification,"
6	which means a valid photographic operator's license, enhanced driver's
7	license, or valid photographic nondriver identification card issued by Vermont
8	or another state or foreign jurisdiction, a U.S. military identification card, a
9	valid provisional alcohol license, or a valid passport or passport card bearing
10	the photograph and signature of the individual upon demand of a licensee, an
11	employee of a licensee, or a law enforcement officer. On the failure of an
12	individual to produce and exhibit a valid authorized form of identification upon
13	demand of a licensee, the licensee shall be entitled to refuse to sell the
14	individual any alcoholic beverage. Sale or furnishing of any alcoholic
15	beverages by a licensee to an individual exhibiting a valid authorized form of
16	identification shall be prima facie evidence of the licensee's compliance with
17	the law prohibiting the sale or furnishing of alcoholic beverages to minors.

3	(a)(1) Prohibited conduct. A person An individual under 21 years of age
4	shall not:
5	(A) falsely represent his or her age for the purpose of procuring or
6	attempting to procure malt or vinous beverages, spirits, or fortified wines from
7	any licensee, State liquor agency, or other person or persons;
8	(B) possess malt or vinous beverages, spirits, or fortified wines for
9	the purpose of consumption by himself or herself or other minors, except in the
10	regular performance of duties as an employee of a licensee licensed to sell
11	alcoholic liquor; or
12	(C) consume malt or vinous beverages, spirits, or fortified wines. A
13	violation of this subdivision may be prosecuted in a jurisdiction where the
14	minor has consumed malt or vinous beverages, spirits, or fortified wines or in a
15	jurisdiction where the indicators of consumption are observed.

17	(3) Exception. Notwithstanding any provision of subdivisions (1)(B)

13	spirits, or fortified wines by a person an individual under the age of 21 years of
14	age who does not hold a provisional alcohol license pursuant to section 602a of

17	(c) A person who violates subsection (a) of this section shall be fined not
18	less than \$500.00 nor more than \$2,000.00 or imprisoned not more than two
19	years, or both. However, an employee of a licensee or an employee of a

3	(A) the purchaser exhibited and the employee carefully viewed

8	(C) the sale was made in good faith, based upon the reasonable belief
