7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to increase the
8	amount of marijuana plants and useable marijuana a dispensary may possess;
9	increase the number of registered caregivers a minor who is a registered patient
10	may have at one time; and permit trained school personnel to act as registered
11	caregivers and administer cannabis to children who are registered patients.

14	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
15	Sec. 1. 18 V.S.A. § 4474(c) is amended to read:
16	(c)(1) A Except as otherwise provided in subdivision (2) of this subsection,
17	a registered caregiver may serve only one registered patient at a time, and a
18	registered patient may have only one registered caregiver at a time.
19	(2) A registered patient who is under 18 years of age may have up to

three registered caregivers. A school nurse, aide, or another registered school

1	employee may act as a caregiver and administer cannabis to a student who is a
2	registered patient.

- (A) In each school year for which possession and administration of cannabis is requested, the student's caregiver shall develop a plan regarding the student's debilitating medical condition.
- (B) The plan of action shall be based upon the written documentation provided by the student's physician and shall include the name of each medication, the dosage, and the times and circumstances under which the medication is to be taken. The written plan shall prominently state that the medication is solely for the use of the student covered by the plan. The parties developing the plan shall determine both to whom the plan, or notification of the plan, shall be given and the person or persons responsible for distribution or notification. The written plan shall become part of the student's health records maintained by the school.
- (C) The student's caregiver shall sign a statement on a form to be provided by the school, releasing the school and its employees and agents, including volunteers, from liability as a result of any injury arising from the student's administration of cannabis, except when the conduct of the school, school employee, or agent would constitute gross negligence, recklessness, or intentional misconduct.
