6 Subject: Taxation; statewide education property tax; study of rates

7 Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to create a study  
8 committee to analyze the variations in property tax rates between economic  
9 centers and surrounding communities, and identify any impacts these  
10 variations have on economic development efforts.

11 An act relating to creating a study committee to study the variation in  
12 property tax rates

13 It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

14 Sec. 1. STUDY COMMITTEE ON PROPERTY TAX RATE VARIATIONS

15 (a) Creation. There is created a Property Tax Rate Variation Study  
16 Committee.

17 (b) Membership. The Committee shall be composed of the following seven  
18 members:

19 (1) three current members of the House of Representatives, not all from  
20 the same political party, who shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House;

1           (2) three current members of the Senate, not all from the same political  
2 party, who shall be appointed by the Committee on Committees; and

3           (3) the Commissioner of Taxes or his or her designee.

4           (c) Powers and duties. The Committee shall study the variation of  
5 municipal property tax rates in the State of Vermont, focusing on the variation  
6 between towns which function as economic hubs or centers and the towns that  
7 surround them, and are more rural, suburban, bedroom-type communities. The  
8 Committee shall study the degree to which the disparity in tax rates could, or  
9 do, in fact, hinder or constrain economic development efforts in economic  
10 centers.

11           (d) Assistance. The Committee shall have the administrative, technical,  
12 and legal assistance of the Joint Fiscal Office, the Office of Legislative  
13 Council, and the Department of Taxes.

14           (e) Report. On or before January 15, 2015, the Committee shall submit a  
15 written report to the Senate Committee on Finance and the House Committee  
16 on Ways and Means with its findings and any recommendations for legislative  
17 action.

18           (f) Meetings.

19           (1) The Commissioner of Taxes shall call the first meeting of the  
20 Committee to occur on or before September 1, 2014.

1           (2) The Committee shall select a chair and vice chair from among the  
2 legislative members at the first meeting.

3           (3)(A) A majority of the members of the Committee shall be physically  
4 present at the same location to constitute a quorum.

5           (B) A member may vote only if physically present at the meeting  
6 location.

7           (C) Action shall be taken only if there is both a quorum and a  
8 majority vote of the members physically present and voting.

9           (4) The Committee shall cease to exist on January 16, 2015.

10          (g) Reimbursement.

11           (1) For attendance at meetings during adjournment of the General  
12 Assembly, legislative members of the Committee shall be entitled to per diem  
13 compensation and reimbursement of expenses pursuant to 2 V.S.A. § 406 for  
14 no more than six meetings.

15           (2) Other members of the Committee who are not employees of the State  
16 of Vermont and who are not otherwise compensated or reimbursed for their  
17 attendance shall be entitled to reimbursement of expenses pursuant to  
18 32 V.S.A. § 1010 for no more than six meetings.

19          Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE

20           This act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
