10	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to prohibit
11	employers from discriminating or retaliating against employees who are absent
12	from work while performing duties as volunteer firefighters.

14	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

16	§ 495o. VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS
17	(a) As used in this section, "firefighter" shall have the same meaning as in
18	20 V.S.A. § 3151(3).

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1	(b) An employer shall not discharge, discriminate, or retaliate against an
2	employee because the employee was absent from work to perform duty as a
3	volunteer firefighter.
4	(c) This section shall not apply to any public safety agency or provider of
5	emergency medical services if, as determined by the employer, the employee's
6	absence would hinder the availability of public safety or emergency medical
7	services.
8	(d) An employee shall notify his or her employer at the time the employee
9	becomes a volunteer firefighter and shall provide the employer with a written
10	statement signed by the chief of the volunteer fire department stating that the
11	employee is a volunteer firefighter.
12	(e) Nothing in this section shall prohibit an employer from requiring an
13	employee to provide reasonable notice that the employee is leaving work to
14	respond to an emergency.
15	(f)(1) An employer shall not be required to compensate an employee for
16	time that an employee is absent from employment while performing his or her
17	duty as a volunteer firefighter.
18	(2)(A) An employer may require an employee to use any accrued time
19	off for time that the employee is absent from work while performing his or her
20	duty as a volunteer firefighter, provided that the employer shall compensate the

employee for any accrued time off used at his or her normal hourly wage rate.

1	(B) Notwithstanding subdivision (A) of this subdivision (f)(2), an
2	employer shall not prevent an employee from performing his or her duty as a
3	volunteer firefighter due to a lack of accrued time off or paid leave.
