13	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
14	Sec. 1. 30 V.S.A. § 218(h) is added to read:
15	(h) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Public
16	Service Board shall issue an order establishing a statewide, low-income energy
17	assistance program. Funding of the program shall be derived from an
18	assessment on electric companies subject to the Board's jurisdiction, as well as
19	on Vermont fuel dealers, in an amount and in a manner determined by the

Board. The Board shall establish eligibility criteria for electric company

1	ratepayers and customers of residential heating fuels, such as propane and
2	heating oil. In designing the program, the Board shall take into account the
3	potential impact on, and cost-shifting to, other ineligible customers and shall
4	also take into consideration other relevant State and federal public assistance
5	programs.

7	30 V.S.A. § 218(e) (low-income electric assistance program) and 33 V.S.A.
8	§ 2607(g) (low-income natural gas assistance program) are repealed.
9	Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE
10	This act shall take effect on passage and any tariff approved under
11	30 V.S.A. § 218(e) (electric) or 33 V.S.A. § 2607(g) (natural gas) shall be void
12	and any remaining funds shall be distributed in a manner determined by the
13	Public Service Board.
