<u>Whereas</u>, the scope of TRORC's policy focus includes all-hazard planning, economic development, energy, environmental planning, GIS mapping, historic preservation, housing, land use planning, and transportation as they impact its region, and

Whereas, Peter Gregory joined the staff of TRORC in 1989 as a planner whose portfolio now encompasses Act 250 reviews, including local land use issues and economic development, and

Whereas, in 2003, the TRORC board of directors recognized Peter Gregory's leadership potential and named him as the organization's executive director, and

<u>Whereas</u>, in his role as TRORC executive director, Peter Gregory supervises the commission's staff, serves as the organization's liaison with all levels of government, and is its leading public voice, and

Whereas, he currently serves as chair of the Vermont State Infrastructure Bank Program, and

<u>Whereas</u>, Peter Gregory is a past president of the Vermont Association of Planning and Development Agencies and was the 2013–2014 president of the National Association of Development Organizations, and
