<u>Whereas</u>, Rebels Elise Mench, Sarah Hackett, Anna Young, Madison Schaefer, Mattea Ringey, Mollie Gribbin, Kazumi Eckenstein, Jen Arnold, Alyssa Lines, Shannon Flaherty, Ashley Norris, Annellie Miller, Caroline McCarthy, Lindsay Geier, Chelsea Austin, Allie Flaherty, Kayla Schaefer, Stephanie Carmichael, Reilly Simoneau, Elise Langevin, Angela Elcan, Sarah Shiman, Amy Simendinger, and Lisa Wood proved one should never discount a team's playoff potential based on its seeding, and
