<u>Whereas</u>, AP courses offer the enrollees an opportunity to study these

subjects at the most challenging level offered in secondary schools, and

<u>Whereas</u>, a primary motivation for a student to take an AP course is to sit for the AP examination in the designated subject, and many colleges and universities offer students who earn a high enough test score either college credit or a waiver from taking preliminary or required courses, and

<u>Whereas</u>, the AP courses in mathematics and the sciences serve as an important springboard for students wishing to pursue careers in these fields, and

<u>Whereas</u>, AP math and science courses and the corresponding AP examinations are offered in biology, calculus, chemistry, computer science, environmental science, physics (electricity and magnetism), physics (mechanics), and statistics, and

<u>Whereas</u>, each year, the College Board, the administrator of the AP exams, in collaboration with the Siemens Foundation present the Siemens Awards for Advanced Placement, which honor students, teachers, and one high school in _{VT LEG 247710.1} each state for their respective accomplishments in the AP science and mathematics exams, and

<u>Whereas</u>, each of the honored high schools is selected "to recognize its commitment to students and leadership in AP participation and performance," and

Whereas, in 2009, the award's judges selected Essex High School as the Vermont high school winner of the Siemens Award for Advanced Placement, and

<u>Whereas</u>, this distinguished honor recognizes the excellence of Essex High's math and science curriculum and the outstanding faculty who serve as its instructors, now therefore be it

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives:
