<u>Whereas</u>, one of the Post's most distinguished members is Vergennes resident Henry Broughton, a U.S. Army Korean War veteran and 59-year member, who has served as the Post's Adjutant, Service Officer, Finance Officer, 1st Vice Commander, and Commander, and

<u>Whereas</u>, Henry Broughton's most enduring role at the Post is his volunteering to organize the annual Vergennes Memorial Day Parade, an important community responsibility he dutifully exercises with great pride, and

<u>Whereas</u>, parade management requires collaborating with many participating organizations and Vergennes municipal officials to ensure that the event is conducted safely, on time, and with minimal difficulty, and

<u>Whereas</u>, Henry Broughton has been a civic leader of many stripes, having served as a Vergennes Alderman and Auditor and as the Vergennes Rotary Club President, and

Whereas, Saint Peter's Catholic Church counts Henry Broughton as a parishioner and one of its lectors, and

Whereas, he is married to Lucille Broughton, and

<u>Whereas</u>, 2017 marks 50 years that Henry Broughton's superb organizational skills have caused the Vergennes Memorial Day Parade to be an eagerly anticipated annual event, now therefore be it
