House concurrent resolution designating March 12–18 as multiple sclerosis week in Vermont

<u>Whereas</u>, multiple sclerosis is a chronic, often disabling disease, of the central nervous system that typically strikes in young adulthood, for which there is currently no cure, and

Whereas, multiple sclerosis affects 400,000 people nationwide, including 8,000-10,000 children and teenagers, and

Whereas, over 1,600 individuals in Vermont have multiple sclerosis, one of the highest per-capita rates in the nation, and

<u>Whereas</u>, there is conclusive evidence of an increased incidence of multiple sclerosis in returning veterans of the Gulf War, and

<u>Whereas</u>, the National Multiple Sclerosis Society is a driving force for multiple sclerosis research that is directed at both establishing preventive and treatment measures and discovering a cure, and

Whereas, the Greater New England Chapter of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society educates, supports, and advocates for afflicted individuals and their families, assists them in maintaining the highest possible quality of life, and encourages these individuals, as well as health professionals and other concerned citizens, to join the movement to advocate for policy change in the priority areas of quality health care, including broader and more comprehensive health insurance coverage, improved long-term care, and increased recognition of disability rights, now therefore be it

## Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives:

That the General Assembly designates the week of March 12–18, 2012 as Multiple Sclerosis Week in Vermont, and be it further
