6	Statement of purpose: This bill proposes to set maximum standards for
7	allowed dose and exposure levels of direct gamma radiation from nuclear
8	power stations.
9 10	An act relating to acceptable dose levels of direct gamma radiation from nuclear power stations
11	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
12	Sec. 1. 18 V.S.A. § 1651a is added to read:
13	§ 1651a. DIRECT GAMMA RADIATION STANDARDS FOR NUCLEAR
14	POWER STATIONS
15	(a) State standards for the exposure of individuals to radiation from nuclear
16	power stations shall be kept as low as is reasonably achievable.
17	(b) In no case shall standards for exposure to direct gamma radiation from
18	nuclear power stations exceed:
19	(1) An annual dose objective of 5 millirems for the total body of an
20	individual in an unrestricted area due to emanations of gamma radiation from a

1	nuclear power station. For the purpose of determining compliance with an
2	annual dose objective, a measurement of exposure of 20 millirems per year of
3	gamma radiation at any point on the site boundary of a nuclear power station
4	shall be considered equivalent to a dose of 5 millirems at the Vermont
5	residence nearest to the nuclear power station.
6	(2) A quarterly average dose of 12 millirems of gamma radiation above
7	background radiation at any site boundary of a nuclear power station.
8	(c) A nuclear power station located in the state shall comply with the state
9	standards established by the department of health under this section.
10	(d) For every month that radiation levels at a facility's fence line exceed the
11	standards established by the department of health under this section, the
12	facility owner will be subject to a fine that will be set at a level that equals 50
13	percent of the corporate profit at the facility for that month.
14	(e) Actions to enforce the provisions of this section shall be brought by the
15	attorney general before the environmental court.
