7	Statement of purpose: This bill proposes to:
8	(1) Begin the process of transferring the cost of special education and the
9	requirements of the No Child Left Behind Act from local budgets to the state.
10	(2) Authorize the commissioner of education to exempt school districts and
11	supervisory unions from state education mandates upon approval of the
12	district's or supervisory union's proposal to implement alternative, less costly
13	measures that meet statutory goals.
14	(3) Permit the department of education to refuse to perform actions
15	mandated by the general assembly unless the state provides 100 percent of the
16	funding to perform the action.
17	(4) Require the general assembly to assume more responsibility for
18	establishing the statewide property tax rate annually.
19	(5) Require a comprehensive study on and proposal for ensuring the
20	efficient and effective use of resources through the consolidation of school
21	districts.

5	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

8	Sec. 1. SPECIAL EDUCATION; NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND ACT
9	(a) The commissioner of education shall identify all state and federal
10	actions necessary for the department to become and to carry out the
11	responsibilities of a local education agency, as that term is defined in 20 U.S.C.
12	<u>§ 7801(26), for purposes of:</u>
13	(1) The receipt and distribution of federal funds, development of
14	individualized education plans, and performance of all other duties required
15	under 20 U.S.C. § 1401 et seq., known as the Individuals with Disabilities
16	Education Act, as amended.
17	(2) The receipt and distribution of federal funds made available to the
18	state under the reauthorization of the federal Elementary and Secondary
19	Education Act of 1965, known as the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, as
20	amended.

1	(b) On or before January 15, 2010, the commissioner of education shall
2	report to the senate and house committees on education, the senate committee

4	the results of the work required in subsection (a) of this section. The
5	commissioner shall provide the committees with a comprehensive outline,
6	including a detailed time line, of the process by which the department shall
7	become the local education agency. The outline shall also identify changes
8	requiring federal consent and proposed amendments to state statute and shall
9	address personnel and funding requirements.

8	Sec. 6. STUDY; SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND SUPERVISORY UNIONS;
9	CONSOLIDATION OF FORM AND FUNCTION
10	(a) There is created a school district and supervisory union consolidation
11	study committee to consist of the following members:
12	(1) The commissioner of education, or the commissioner's designee,
13	who shall serve as chair.
14	(2) The executive director of the Vermont Superintendents' Association,
15	Inc. or the director's designee.
16	(3) The executive director of the Vermont School Boards Association,
17	Inc. or the director's designee.
18	(4) The executive director of the Vermont Principals' Association or the
19	director's designee.
20	(5) The president of the VT – National Education Association, or the
21	president's designee.

1	(b) The committee shall study ways in which consolidation of the structure
2	and functions of supervisory unions, supervisory districts, and school districts

5	house committees on education a detailed plan by which consolidation can best
6	be accomplished.
7	(c) The commissioner shall arrange for the first meeting of the committee
8	to occur no later than July 15, 2009. Members shall serve without
9	compensation. The department of education shall provide staff services.
10	(d) On or before January 15, 2010, the committee shall present its proposed
11	plan for consolidation to the senate and house committees on education. The
12	plan shall evaluate the fiscal and operational issues considered during
13	development of the proposal and shall include a detailed time line for
14	implementation.
