1	(b) A conviction of an offense in 13 V.S.A. chapter 72 or a similar offense
2	in another jurisdiction shall be sufficient evidence of a sexual assault for
3	purposes of this section; however, a conviction is not required and the court
4	may consider other evidence of a sexual assault in making its determination.
5	(c) An order issued in accordance with this section shall be permanent and
6	shall not be subject to modification.
7	(d) A court shall not issue a parent-child contact order in a case in which a
