6	Statement of purpose: This bill proposes to require a staffing ratio of nursing
7	staff to renal dialysis patients that is sufficient to ensure patient safety.

9	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
10	Sec. 1. 18 V.S.A. chapter 59 is added to read:
11	CHAPTER 59. STAFFING FOR PATIENT SAFETY
12	§ 2601. RENAL DIALYSIS PATIENT SAFETY
13	(a) As used in this section:
14	(1) "Ambulatory care facility" means a facility providing health care
15	services not requiring an overnight stay.
16	(2) "Direct care nurse" or "direct care nursing personnel" means a
17	licensed practical nurse, registered nurse, or advanced practice registered
18	nurse, licensed pursuant to chapter 28 of Title 26.
19	(3) "Renal dialysis" means the removal of waste and other materials
20	from a patient's blood through artificial means.

l	(b)(1) Each ambulatory care facility that provides for the treatment of
2	individuals with kidney disease through the use of renal dialysis shall maintain
3	on site sufficient direct care nursing personnel to ensure that all patients
4	undergoing dialysis have nursing care at all times provided by direct care
5	nurses trained in patient care related to renal dialysis. For purposes of this
6	section, "sufficient direct care nursing personnel" means at least one direct
7	care nurse and three technicians for every nine patients; nurses and technicians
8	performing duties other than direct care to patients shall not be included in the
9	staffing ratio.
10	(2) If renal dialysis is performed in more than one room of the
11	ambulatory care facility, at least one registered nurse shall be present at all
12	times in each room in which a patient is undergoing renal dialysis. The
13	registered nurse may be included in the staffing ratio required pursuant to
14	subdivision (1) of this subsection only if he or she is providing direct care to
15	renal dialysis patients.

- (c) An ambulatory care facility shall maintain a sufficient level of staffing of nondirect care personnel to ensure that each direct care staff member is able to perform direct care services.
