18	(2) 16- to 30-year-old Vermonters who are not in the labor force;

10	Youth Mentoring Program, the purpose of which shall be to provide paid work	
11	experiences for Vermont youths, working with mentoring professionals, that	
12	have academic and occupational education as a component, including:	
13	(1) a summer youth employment program for high school juniors and	
14	seniors; and	
15	(2) nonseasonal employment, preapprenticeship programs, and on-the-	
16	job training, for an at-risk youth employment program targeted for 18-24-year-

6	The Commissioner of Labor and Workforce Development, as the	
7	designated leader of workforce education and training pursuant to section 540	
8	of this title, shall exercise his or her authority and collaborate with all	
9	necessary partners within and outside State government to execute the	
10	following workforce development strategies within and through the	
11	Department of Labor and Workforce Development:	
12	(1) create a clearinghouse of all workforce education and training	
13	opportunities across the State;	
14	(2) implement cross training of staff at all levels to ensure all staff are	
15	familiar with one another's programs and activities;	
16	(3) develop a common intake and joint referral process;	
17	(4) create a partnership with the Department for Children and Families
