6	Statement of purpose: This bill proposes to regulate mixed martial arts
7	matches.
8	An act relating to mixed martial arts
9	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
10	Sec. 1. 31 V.S.A. chapter 21 is amended to read:
11	CHAPTER 21. BOXING AND MIXED MARTIAL ARTS
12	§ 1101. DEFINITIONS
13	As used in this chapter:
14	(1) "Boxer" means an individual who participates in a boxing match.
15	(2) "Boxing match" or "match" means a contest or training exhibition
16	for a prize or purse where an admission fee is charged and where individuals
17	score points by striking the head and upper torso of an opponent with padded
18	fists. An amateur boxing match is a match held under the supervision of a
19	school, college, or university or under the supervision of United States
20	Amateur Boxing, Inc. or its successor as the nationally-designated nationally

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1	designated governing body for amateur boxing. All other matches shall be
2	considered professional boxing matches.
3	(3) "Director" means the director of the office of professional
4	regulation.
5	(4) "Disciplinary action" includes any action by the administrative law
6	officer appointed under section 3 V.S.A. § 129 of Title 3, premised upon a
7	finding of wrongdoing. It includes all sanctions of any kind, denying,
8	suspending, revoking, issuing warnings, and other sanctions.
9	(5) "Manager" means a person who receives compensation for service
10	as an agent or representative of a professional boxer or mixed martial artist.
11	(6) "National boxer registry" means an entity certified by the
12	Association of Boxing Commissions for the purpose of maintaining records for
13	the identification of professional boxers and for tracking their records and
14	suspensions.
15	(7) "Participant" means managers, seconds, referees, and judges in a
16	professional boxing match or mixed martial arts match.
17	(8) "Promoter" means a person that organizes, holds, advertises, or
18	otherwise conducts a professional boxing match or mixed martial arts match.

(9) "Mixed martial arts" means unarmed combat involving the use of a

combination of techniques from different disciplines of the martial arts,

including grappling, kicking, and striking.

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1	(10) "Mixed martial arts match" means a match or exhibition in which a
2	mixed martial arts contestant competes with another mixed martial arts
3	contestant for a prize or purse and an admission fee is charged.
4	§ 1102. DIRECTOR; POWERS; DUTIES
5	(a) The director shall have jurisdiction over professional boxing matches
6	and mixed martial arts matches. The director's power to supervise
7	professional boxing matches and mixed martial arts matches includes the
8	power to suspend a match immediately if there is a serious and immediate
9	danger to the public, boxers, mixed martial arts contestants, promoters, or
10	participants.
11	(b) Except as provided in this subsection, the director shall not have
12	jurisdiction over amateur boxing matches or mixed martial arts matches.
13	Amateur boxing matches shall be conducted according to the rules of United
14	States Amateur Boxing, Inc., the national governing body for amateur boxing
15	of the United States Olympic Committee or its successor as the
16	nationally designated nationally designated governing body for amateur
17	boxing. However, upon a finding that the health and safety of the boxers and
18	participants in an amateur match are not being sufficiently safeguarded, the
19	director shall assume jurisdiction over and supervisory responsibility for the

match. The director's decision may be appealed to the administrative law

officer appointed under section 3 V.S.A. § 129 of Title 3 within 10 days of the

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1	date the finding is issued. If the director assumes jurisdiction under this
2	subsection, the match shall continue to be conducted in accordance with the
3	rules of United States Amateur Boxing, Inc.
4	(c) The director shall:
5	(1) provide information to applicants for registration;
6	(2) administer fees collected under this chapter;
7	(3) explain appeal procedures to registrants and applicants and
8	complaint procedures to the public;
9	(4) receive applications for registration, grant registration under this
10	chapter, renew registrations and deny, revoke, suspend, reinstate, or condition
11	registrations as directed by an administrative law officer;
12	(5) refer all complaints and disciplinary matters to an administrative law
13	officer appointed under section 3 V.S.A. § 129 of Title 3.
14	(d) The director may adopt rules necessary to perform his or her duties
15	under this chapter. The uniform rules of the Association of Boxing
16	Commissions as adopted on June 6, 1998, and as amended from time to time,
17	shall apply to professional boxing matches conducted under this chapter to the
18	extent those rules address matters not covered by rules adopted by the director
19	§ 1103. ADVISOR APPOINTEES
20	(a) The secretary of state shall appoint two persons to serve as advisors in

matters related to boxing and mixed martial arts. One advisor shall be a person

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with at least three years' experience with boxing or mixed martial arts, and one
shall be a medical doctor. The advisor appointees shall be appointed for
staggered five-year terms and shall serve at the pleasure of the secretary.

- (b) The director shall seek the advice of the advisors appointed under this section in carrying out the provisions of this chapter. The advisors shall be entitled to compensation and necessary expenses in the amount provided in section 32 V.S.A. § 1010 of Title 32 for attendance at any meeting called by the director for this purpose.
- (c) For purposes of the federal Professional Boxing Safety Act of 1995, as amended, the director and the advisor appointees shall be deemed to be the Vermont state boxing commission.

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§ 1105. PROMOTERS; REGISTRATION; BOND REQUIREMENT

- (a) A person shall not act as a promoter in this state unless he or she is registered with the office of professional regulation. The application shall be made on forms provided by the director and shall be filed at least 14 days prior to the date of the intended professional boxing match or mixed martial arts match.
- (b) Each application shall be accompanied by a surety or cash bond in the amount of \$5,000.00, payable to the state of Vermont, together with proof of medical insurance covering the boxers or mixed martial arts contestants for

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- injuries sustained during the match. The bond or surety shall be conditioned upon the faithful performance by the promoter of the provisions of this chapter, the fulfillment of the promoter's contractual obligations with the boxers and participants and subject to the payment of any fees or penalties imposed by this chapter.
- (c) Each application shall contain a list of the boxers, mixed martial arts contestants, and participants, along with each boxer's personal identification number assigned by the national boxer registry.

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§ 1108. MATCHES; SPECIAL PROVISIONS

- (a) The director shall designate one or more individuals who shall act as boxing inspectors for professional boxing matches, inspectors for mixed martial arts matches, and, at the discretion of the director, at amateur boxing matches to insure ensure that boxing or mixed martial arts laws and rules are strictly observed. Boxing inspectors Inspectors shall have all the powers of the director with regard to regulation of a match. Inspectors shall have free access to the dressing rooms of the boxers and shall be present at the weigh-in.
- (b) Before a professional match, the promoter shall insure that each boxer or mixed martial arts contestant is examined by a physician licensed in this state for the purpose of certifying that the boxer or contestant is physically fit to compete safely. Copies of the physician's certificate shall be filed with the

1	director prior to the match. In addition, at any time prior to a pro	fessional
2	match, the director may require that a boxer or contestant underg	o a physical
3	examination, which may include neurological tests and procedure	es.
4	(c) A physician approved by the director must be continuously	y present at
5	ringside during every professional boxing match and mixed mart	ial arts match
6	to observe the physical condition of the boxers and mixed martia	<u>l arts</u>
7	contestants. The physician shall advise the referee on the conditi	on of the
8	boxers and contestants.	
9	(d) The promoter shall insure that an ambulance and medical	personnel,
10	with appropriate resuscitation equipment, are continuously present	nt at the site
11	during a professional boxing match or mixed martial arts match.	
12	§ 1109. FEES	
13	(a) Applicants and persons regulated by this chapter shall be	subject to the
14	following fees:	
15	(1) Promoter registration	\$500.00
16	(2) Boxer or mixed martial arts contestant registration	\$ 25.00
17	(3) Manager registration	\$ 25.00
18	(4) Second registration	\$ 25.00
19	(5) Referee registration	\$ 25.00

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1	(7) Biennial renewal for professional	
2	boxers, mixed martial arts contestants, managers,	
3	seconds, referees, and judges \$ 25.00	
4	(b) If the director exercises jurisdiction over an amateur match under	
5	section 122 of this title, the person that organized, held, advertised or otherwis	e
6	conducted the match shall pay a fee of \$500.00.

8	§ 1112. GROUNDS FOR DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS	
9	(a) An applicant or a registrant shall be subject to disciplinary action for the	e
10	conduct listed in this section and in 3 V.S.A. § 129a:	
11	(1) A boxer or mixed martial arts contestant, for fighting after failing a	
12	pre-fight physical examination.	
13	(2) A promoter:	
14	(A) for permitting a nonregistered boxer to participate in a match; or	
15	(B) for participating in a match or allowing a boxer or other	
16	participant to participate in a match while under suspension in another state or	
17	by another boxing regulatory organization.	
18	(3) A promoter, boxer, mixed martial arts contestant, or participant, for	
19	violating any requirement of this chapter or any rule adopted under this	
20	chapter.	

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1	(b) After hearing, and upon a finding of wrongdoing, the administrative
2	law officer appointed under subsection 3 V.S.A. § 129(j) of Title 3 may take
3	disciplinary action against a registrant or an applicant.
4	§ 1113. TAX ON PROFESSIONAL BOXING <u>AND MIXED MARTIAL</u>
5	ARTS CONTESTS
6	Any person holding or conducting a professional boxing match or mixed
7	martial arts match shall notify the director not less than five days in advance of
8	the holding of the match, and after the match is concluded shall immediately
9	pay to the director a sum, designated as a gate tax, which shall be an amount
10	equal to five percent of the gross receipts, exclusive of any federal tax thereon.
11	Gate tax shall be deposited in the professional regulatory fee fund and used to
12	carry out the provisions of this chapter. Payments required by this section
13	shall be accompanied by reports in the form required by the director. All

tickets of admission to a professional boxing match or mixed martial arts

match shall bear clearly the purchase price on the face of the ticket.
