17	to all lawful subjects and purposes, but only to the extent such authority is
18	given under the terms of the power of attorney, subject to section 3506 of this
19	title and subsections (b) through (g) of this section.

1	(2) A general power of attorney created under this subchapter may be
2	construed to grant powers that are not expressly delineated in the terms of the
3	power of attorney if it appears from the relevant facts and circumstances that
4	the principal intended the agent to have general authority to act on the
5	principal's behalf.
