6	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to create the	
7	Vermont National Guard Educational Assistance Program to enable members	
8	of the Vermont National Guard to take courses tuition free at the University o	
9	Vermont and State Agricultural College, the Vermont State Colleges, and	
10	participating private postsecondary educational institutions, and to phase out	
11	the interest-free loan educational program currently available to members of	
12	the Vermont National Guard.	
13 14	An act relating to the Vermont National Guard Educational Assistance Program	
15	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:	
16	Sec. 1. TITLE	
17	This act shall be known as the Vermont National Guard Educational	
18	Assistance Act.

3 PROGRAM

(a) The Vermont National Guard Educational Assistance Program
(Program) is created, under which a member of the Vermont National Guard
(member) who meets the eligibility requirements in subsection (b) of this
section is entitled to take courses tuition free at the University of Vermont and
State Agricultural College (UVM) or a Vermont State College. A member
attending UVM or a Vermont State College under this Program shall be
charged the applicable resident tuition rate, regardless of the residency status
of the member. In addition, the Program shall provide a scholarship at a
participating private postsecondary educational institution up to the applicable
resident tuition rate at UVM but in no event greater than the applicable resident
tuition rate otherwise charged by the participating private postsecondary
educational institution. For purposes of this section, a participating private
postsecondary educational institution is a private postsecondary educational
institution located in Vermont that agrees with the Vermont National Guard
and the Corporation to participate in the Program. The tuition benefit provided
under the Program shall be paid on behalf of the member by the Corporation,
subject to the appropriation of funds by the General Assembly specifically for
this purpose. The amount of tuition for a member who attends an educational

1	institution under the Program on less than a full-time basis shall be reduced to			
2	reflect the member's course load, at the rate of one month of Vermont National			
3	Guard service commitment for each credit hour with a maximum of 12 credit			
4	hours per semester. The tuition benefit shall be conditioned upon the			
5	member's executing a promissory note obligating the member to repay the			
6	member's tuition benefit, in whole or in part, if the member fails to complete			
7	the period of Vermont National Guard service required in subsection (c) of this			
8	section, or if the member's benefit is terminated pursuant to subdivision (d)(1)			
9	of this section.			
10	(b) To be eligible for the Program, an individual, whether a resident or			
11	nonresident, shall satisfy all of the following requirements:			
12	(1) be an active member of the Vermont National Guard;			
13	(2) have successfully completed basic training;			
14	(3) be enrolled at UVM, a Vermont State College, or a participating			
15	private postsecondary educational institution in a program that leads to an			
16	undergraduate certificate or degree;			
17	(4) have not previously earned an undergraduate bachelor's degree;			
18	(5) continually demonstrate satisfactory academic progress as			
19	determined by criteria established by the Vermont National Guard and the			
20	Corporation, in consultation with the educational institution in which the			
21	individual is enrolled;			

1	(6) have exhausted any post-September 11, 2001 tuition benefits and		
2	other federally funded military tuition assistance; provided, however, that this		
3	subdivision shall not apply to Montgomery GI Bill benefits, post-		
4	September 11, 2001 educational program housing allowances, federal		
5	educational entitlements, National Guard scholarship grants, loans under		
6	section 2856 of this title, and other nontuition benefits; and		
7	(7) have submitted a statement of good standing to the Corporation		
8	signed by the individual's commanding officer within 30 days prior to the		
9	beginning of each semester.		
10	(c) For each full academic year of attendance under the Program, a member		
11	shall be required to serve two years in the Vermont National Guard in order to		
12	receive the full tuition benefit under the Program. If a member's service with		
13	the Vermont National Guard terminates before fulfilling this two-year service		
14	commitment, other than for cause, as determined by the Vermont National		
15	Guard, the individual shall reimburse the Corporation a pro rata portion of the		
16	tuition paid under the Program pursuant to the terms of an interest-free		
17	reimbursement promissory note signed by the individual at the time of entering		
18	the Program.		
19	(d)(1) The Office of the Vermont Adjutant and Inspector General may		
20	terminate the educational assistance provided an individual under the		
21	Program if:		

1	(A) the individual's commanding officer revokes the statement of		
2	good standing submitted pursuant to subdivision (b)(7) of this section as a		
3	result of an investigation or disciplinary action that occurred after the stateme		
4	of good standing was issued;		
5	(B) the individual is dismissed from the educational institution in		
6	which the individual is enrolled under the Program for academic or		
7	disciplinary reasons; or		
8	(C) the individual withdraws from the educational institution in		
9	which the individual is enrolled under the Program without good cause.		
10	(2) If an individual's educational assistance is terminated pursuant to		
11	subdivision (1) of this subsection, the individual shall reimburse the		
12	Corporation for the tuition paid under the Program, pursuant to the terms of an		
13	interest-free reimbursement promissory note signed by the individual at the		
14	time of entering the Program, shall be responsible on a pro rata basis for the		
15	remaining tuition cost for the current semester or any courses in which the		
16	individual is currently enrolled, and shall be ineligible to receive future		
17	educational assistance under the Program.		
18	(e) If an individual is dismissed for academic or disciplinary reasons from		
19	any postsecondary educational institution before receiving tuition benefits		
20	under the Program, the Office of the Adjutant and Inspector General may make		

1	a determination regarding the individual's eligibility to receive educational		
2	assistance under the Program.		
3	(f)(1) The Corporation, in consultation with the Office of the Adjutant and		
4	Inspector General, shall adopt policies, procedures, and guidelines necessary to		
5	implement the provisions of this section, which shall include eligibility,		
6	application, and acceptance requirements, data sharing guidelines, and the		
7	criteria for determining "cause" as used in subsection (c) of this section and		
8	"good cause" as used in subdivision (d)(1)(C) of this section.		
9	(2) UVM, the Vermont State Colleges, and participating private		
10	postsecondary educational institutions shall adopt policies and procedures for		
11	the enrollment of members under the Program. These policies and procedures		
12	shall be consistent with the policies, procedures, and guidelines adopted by the		
13	Corporation under subdivision (1) of this subsection.		
14	(g) On or before November 1 of each year, the President of UVM, the		
15	Chancellor of the Vermont State Colleges, and the president or equivalent		
16	position of each participating private postsecondary educational institution		
17	shall report to the Governor and the House and Senate Committees on		
18	Education regarding the number of members enrolled at their institutions		
19	during the prior fiscal year who are receiving educational assistance under the		
20	Program and, to the extent available, the courses or program in which the		

1	members are enrolled. The provisions of 2 V.S.A. § 20(d) (expiration of		
2	reports) shall not apply to the reports to be made under this subsection.		
3	Sec. 3. REPEAL		
4	16 V.S.A. § 2856 (educational assistance; interest free loans) is repealed on		
5	July 1, 2019.		
6	Sec. 4. TRANSITION		
7	(a) A member of the Vermont National Guard who received a loan on or		
8	before July 1, 2019 under 16 V.S.A. § 2856 shall be entitled to the benefits		
9	under the Vermont National Guard Educational Assistance Program if the		
10	member satisfies the eligibility criteria under that Program. The benefits under		
11	the Vermont National Guard Educational Assistance Program shall only be		
12	available through the fall semester of 2019.		
13	(b) The Corporation, in consultation with the Office of the Adjutant and		
14	Inspector General, shall adopt guidelines for participants transitioning from the		
15	loan program under 16 V.S.A. § 2856 to the benefits under the Vermont		
16	National Guard Educational Assistance Program.		
17	(c) If a loan provided to a Vermont National Guard member under		
18	16 V.S.A. § 2856 is repayable pursuant to the terms of the loan on or after		
19	July 1, 2019 (the date 16 V.S.A. § 2856 is repealed), the member shall repay		
20	the loan in accordance with its terms unless and to the extent canceled or		
21	forgiven by the Corporation.		

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- This act shall take effect on July 1, 2018 and the tuition benefits established
- 3 under the Vermont National Guard Educational Assistance Program shall be
- 4 <u>available to eligible Vermont National Guard members enrolled in institutions</u>
- 5 under the Program starting on or after January 1, 2019.
