5	Subject: Health; Vermont state hospital; canteen
6	Statement of purpose: This bill proposes to require that the superintendent of
7	the Vermont state hospital provide a canteen at the hospital.
8	An act relating to reopening the canteen at the Vermont state hospital
9	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
10	Sec. 1. 18 V.S.A. § 7108 is amended to read:
11	§ 7108. CANTEENS
12	The superintendents superintendent of the Vermont State Hospital and the
13	Training School may state hospital shall conduct a canteen or commissary,
14	which shall be accessible to patients, students, employees, and visitors of the
15	state hospital and training school at designated hours and shall be operated by
16	employees of the hospital and the school. A revolving fund for this purpose is
17	authorized. The salary of an employee of the hospital or training school shall
18	be charged against the canteen fund. Proceeds from sales may be used for

operation of the canteen and the benefit of the patients, students and employees

of the hospital or training school under the direction of the superintendents and

subject to the approval of the commissioner. All balances of such funds
remaining at the end of any fiscal year shall remain in such fund for use during
the succeeding fiscal year. An annual report of the status of the funds shall be
submitted to the commissioner. The superintendent may operate the canteen or
commissary, provide the services of the canteen or commissary in accordance
with subchapter 9 of chapter 5 of Title 21 or if no person eligible under
subchapter 9 is able to operate the facility in a fashion that is acceptable to the
superintendent or in a fashion that is revenue neutral to the state general fund,
the superintendent may seek bids from private persons wishing to operate the
facility. In any case, the superintendent shall provide the canteen or
commissary so that it is self-supporting and does not require a subsidy from
the general fund.
